Leave a comment Cottondale (Often called 'Cotton' or 'Cottondale') is an historic county town of the southwest English county of Devon and a former borough in the county. The town was created a royal borough in 1330 and grew in size through the late Middle Ages, becoming a leading local centre. During the 19th century, the town became the administrative centre for the many slate quarries in the surrounding area, and grew rapidly. It became a railway town, connected by branch lines to Exeter, the South Hams, Plymouth, and Croydon. Following the heavy industrialisation of the 20th century, the town has become a commuter town for Plymouth and Exeter and forms the boundary of the areas of South Hams and Devon Council. The principal industries are tourism, agriculture, and education. Between 1801 and 1930 the population grew from 500 to 15,500. It became a popular tourist destination in the Victorian era. Many of the magnificent brick built houses in the centre of the town are built of locally quarried stone. Local slate quarries shave long since closed, although the King's Head and the Quarry Mill are open to the public and provide an insight into the town's industrial past. Other local industry. The town is a busy service and retail centre, with the town square a popular place for visiting shoppers. The town contains a regular programme of events, including the Devon Folk and Country Fair, a local arts and crafts festival, 'Cotton in the Park', which has been running for over 40 years. The population of the town was recorded as 13,025 in the 520fdb1ae7
