The year is almost over and the holiday season has begun. Not sure about everyone else but I'm not ready. This year has been a wonderful year for philanthropy. We have accomplished so much, thanks to all of you.

The New Year will have some exciting changes as Philanthropy is going to be trying some new ways of accomplishing our goals. There will be some sign up sheets at our monthly Guild Meeting for members to volunteer to help with the ongoing tasks. Please take a few minutes to check and see if any of the positions would suit you. None of them will take up very much time as it will only be one task. More will be explained at the Guild Meeting.

The next Philanthropy Sew Day will be Wednesday, January 5, 2026, still at the Driftwood Mobile Home Park, 15621 Beach Blvd., Westminster. Hours are from 9:30 to approximately 2:30. You are welcome to bring a sewing machine and work on your own Philanthropy project or you can do a needed task. Come and go as your time permits. There is a refrigerator and microwave available for our use so bring a lunch and drink.

We have made progress in catching up with the quilting, but we still have a long way to go. Thanks to those of you that have taken quilts to quilt. It is amazing how beautiful they all turn out.

In January we need to make pillowcase kits because we have distributed most of the ones we have in stock. Fabric is available to choose from.

So far this year we have given away **481 QUILTS and 494 PILLOWCASES, which have** been distributed among Orangewood Children's Home, Precious Life Shelter, Thomas House, Seacrest/ Providence Hospice, the Marines, Ronald McDonald House, Orange Coast Hospital, and Radiant Futures. This does not include the baby baskets and infant blankets which are sent to the Marines. Also, there will be one more delivery of Mug Rugs.

As usual I want to thank everyone that has helped make this a successful program. You are the BEST!!
