Students are usually eight to nine weeks old, but not staff, depending on the country and district. In the United States, summer holidays are approximately two and a half months, with students usually ending the school year between the end of May and the end of June and starting the new year from early August to early September. In Azerbaijan, Spain, Ireland, Italy, Greece, Georgia, Lithuania, Latvia, Lebanon, Romania and Russia, the summer break is usually three months, compared to three to six weeks (sometimes 2 months) in Australia, Brazil, the UK, Pakistan, Bangladesh, India, Denmark, the Netherlands and Germany. Criticism and support for research around the impact of summer holidays is mixed. Summer loss of learning (or summer slide) is a perceived loss of student learning experience due to aborted education, but the exact consequences of long breaks are unclear. Proponents of breaks tend to focus on the need to give children time away from childhood stress, sometimes associated with school, including peer pressure, cliques, bullying, and the pressure of heavy workloads. For Argentina, the school year ends in early or mid-December and begins in late February or early March. Also, most students receive two weeks of vacation during the winter, which varies from region to region from late July or mid-July to early August. Primary Education: Mid-December to the end of February (2 months) Secondary education: From early December to early March (3 months) University education: From the last day of December (December 31) to the beginning of April 1, Australia In Australia summer officially lasts from December 1 to February 28, and therefore includes traditional holidays such as Hanukkah, Christmas and New Year. Australian school holidays are determined by each state's department of education. The Christmas summer holidays are the longest in duration. Usually summer holidays in Australia last about six weeks, usually from the end of December (depending on the level of the school) until the end of January. It's significantly shorter than the North American summer holidays, but Australian schools also break for 2 weeks in April and June and September, giving students and teachers a total of twelve weeks of annual holidays. In many public schools, 10, and 12 years 15, allowing time to complete the marking exam and the results. Year 10 usually ends at the end of November, year 11 at the end of October, and year 12 (senior year) is also in mid or late October after 3 weeks of year-end exams. This can result in a normal 12 weeks of leave for up to 20 weeks of leave. Intermediate periods of school without holidays are called school conditions, each period of which lasts about ten weeks. All Australian states have relatively similar holiday periods between each semester, but there is an opportunity for that to change, as was the case at Melbourne's 2006 Commonwealth Games, when the first term in Victorian schools was reduced to six weeks and another subsequently extended to 12 weeks due to serious disruptions in public and private bus networks used by schoolchildren. Most private schools in Australia have up to four weeks of extra holidays due to their longer hours of study over time. Austria In Austria, summer vacation dates vary by region, but the break lasts nine weeks across the country. The school usually ends in early July and starts in early September. Bangladesh In Bangladesh, summer holidays start in mid-May and end in mid-June (4 weeks). In addition, in many schools, the holiday during the month of Ramadan (around mid-May until about mid-April) is referred to as the summer holidays. Summer there is associated with the presence of fruits such as mangoes (আম/aam) and jackfruits (কাঠাল / kaathaal). Thus, summer holidays are sometimes referred to in Bangladesh as আম-কাঠালের ছুটি ,pronounced aam-kaathaaler chhuti), which roughly translates as the mango-jackfruit holiday. Also, summer vacations are sometimes not in line with actual weather conditions in the summer, causing students to have to get to school in the heat. Summer holidays don't matter much in places other than schools. Barbados In Barbados, summer vacation dates have changed over the years due to the start of the hurricane season on June 1. Because of this, major storms affecting the island could cause schools to remain closed for days as a result of the rollback of vacation dates, such as since Hurricane Thomas in 2010. Currently, summer holidays begin in late June or early July and end in the second week of September. Belgium In Belgium, summer holidays last from July 1 to September 1 (2 months). Bolivia In Bolivia, summer holidays runs from early December to early February (2 months). Bosnia and Herzegovina In Bosnia and Herzegovina, the beginning of the summer holidays varies depending on the school, but usually starts in early or mid-June. School starts on the first Monday in September. Brazil In Brazil, summer vacations vary by region, state and school administration. Brazil's education system is federalized, state and municipal municipal all of which can create their own calendars, along with this, each federal authority can support schools at any of the levels of education, meaning that even in the same municipal city supported by high school, public high school, and private high school have different calendars, resulting in summer vacations not simultaneously nationwide or even the city. The federal Education Act (Lei de Diretrizes e Bases da Educa'o Nacional) stipulates that primary and secondary education must consist of at least 800 hours per year, distributed between a minimum of 200 school days, allowing schools to plan school years that go beyond the mandatory minimum. In terms of dates, summer holidays can last from 45 to 60 days; late November to early December to late January to early February. In addition, for most Brazilian students there are two to four weeks of winter in July; Winter holidays were held in August 2016 only in connection with the Summer Olympic Games 2016. Bulgaria In Bulgaria, the break time varies depending on the class of students. The following periods apply: 1-3rd grade: May 31 - September 15th 4th-6th grade: June 15 - September 15th 7-11th grade: June 30 - September 15th 12th grade: the school year ends in mid-May. Note that the 8th grade, which focuses on the summer holidays of intensive language learning, also begins on June 30, not June 15. Canada In Canada, the first day of summer holidays for public schools is the last Saturday in June. However, in some provinces students get a professional day job on the last Friday of this academic week, and their last day will be Thursday. Depending on the province, students can get 2-3 months of

summer vacation. This can vary in quebec (previously due to the provincial June 24 holiday). The last day of the summer holidays is Labor Day. This can vary in private schools. School usually resumes the day after Labor Day (September). Chile In Chile, summer holidays last from early or mid-December to late February or early March (10, 11 or 12 weeks). China In the People's Republic of China summer holidays begin in early July and often end in early September (2 months). Colombia's summer vacations vary. Because of Colombia's equatorial climate (see Climate Colombia), schools operate two different calendars. Public schools and some private schools operate Calendar A, which has a break between June and July. Only some private schools have Calendar B, which has long vacations in July and August. Costa Rica In Costa Rica, the summer vacation lasts 2 months. Usually start at the end of December and end in early February. There are several schools using American style, these schools tend to take leave at the end and then resume again in early August. Croatia In Croatia, school school ends around June 15 and usually starts on the first Monday in September, but if the first Monday is September 1 or 2, the school year will begin on the second Monday. Czech Republic Summer Holidays begin on July 1 and end on August 31 (2 months). Denmark In Denmark, summer holidays last from late June to early or mid-August (6 weeks). High schools (colleges) usually return to school in early August, but for younger students it can be in the middle. Ecuador In Ecuador summer holidays vary. Due to Ecuador's equatorial climate (see Ecuador Climate for more information), schools operate two different calendars. The coastal region runs a January or February vacation, but in the Sierra region, summer vacations follow the pattern in July and August. Egypt In Egypt summer holidays last from early or mid-June to mid-September (3 months / 14 weeks) in public schools, although the length is slightly different depending on age. In most private schools, summer holidays last from mid or late June to early September (2.5 months / 10 weeks) Estonia In Estonia summer holidays start in early June, the date of different classes. The school starts every year from September 1. Ethiopia In Ethiopia, the school year usually ends at the end of May to mid-June and begins in mid-September (8 to 12 weeks). Finland In Finland, summer holidays start on Saturday (in the 22nd week) in late May or early June. The holiday lasts from 2 to 2/2 months. Typically, the school starts again on the date between August 7 and 18. France In France, the summer holidays usually consists of July and August (2 months), although secondary school students finish in mid-June because of senior exams. This can vary for private schools. Germany In Germany, summer holidays last from six to six and a half weeks. The exact dates vary by state, as well as from one to the following year, from the earliest (mid-June to the end of July) to the last (late July to early September). In Germany, annual holidays are divided into winter holidays (about one week), Easter holidays (mostly about two weeks), summer holidays (about six and a half weeks), autumn holidays (about one to two weeks) and Christmas holidays (about one to two weeks). Some states like Bavaria also have holidays for Pentecost. Greece In Greece, the summer holidays last 3 months. Schools close on 14 June and reopen on 11 September. Universities usually close in mid-July, but with large differences between faculties. Guatemala In Guatemala, summer holidays begin in mid-October and end in early January (about 12 weeks). Guyana In Guyana summer holidays begin in early July and end in early September (2 months). Hungary In Hungary, summer holidays usually last from mid-June (June 15) to September (first working day). It's about 11 or 12 weeks. Weeks. In Hong Kong, summer holidays usually start in mid-July and end at the end of August (6-7 weeks) for most public schools. However, the start and end times of international schools are variable. For example, most ESF-based schools start at the end of June and end in mid-August (7 weeks). Iceland In Iceland, the duration of the summer holidays can vary from one school to another. Students usually start their summer holidays during the first week of June and return to school in the fourth week of August. India India covers a wide range of climatic conditions, which leads to a significant change in the start time and duration of summer holidays in different regions of the country. In northern India, summer holidays usually start in mid-May and end by early July. The exceptions are Himalayan Jammu and Kashmir, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh, where summer holidays are short and winter breaks are much longer. In Jammu and Kashmir, for example, summer holidays last only ten days, and instead a long winter break from mid-December to the end of February. In central India, summer holidays begin in mid-April and schools reopen in mid-June. In the south, schools end in the last week of March and resume in early June. In the northeastern states, the new school year begins before the holidays, in April. A few weeks later, schools end their summer holidays between May and June, the hottest months of the year. In addition, the summer holidays in most schools last no more than six weeks. The duration may be reduced to three weeks for older students. Iran In Iran summer holidays last three months. Schools close in mid-June and reopen at the end of September. However, most private high schools make it mandatory for students to attend school for about 2 months during the summer. That means students end up with a 2-week break after the final, and another 2-week break before school starts again at the end of September. Iraq In Iraq, summer holidays begin at the end of May and end at the end of September, but the 12th class holidays begin at the end of June and end in mid-October, and the 9th grade starts from mid-June to September. Ireland In the Republic of Ireland, most secondary schools begin summer holidays in late May or early June. However, junior and leaving certificate exams will take place in June. Schools usually reopen in late August until early September. Primary schools in the Republic of Ireland are sixteen days longer, so they start their summer holidays at the end of June but do not return until the first week of September. Private schools follow the same pattern. Summer holidays in Israel for secondary and secondary school students start on June 21 and end on August 31 (two months and 10 Summer holidays for elementary school students start on July 1 and end on August 31 (two months). Italy In Italy, summer summer For primary, secondary and secondary schools usually starts in the second week of June and lasts until the second week of September included, a total of three months. For kindergartens, summer holidays start at the end of June and last until the first week of September. Final exams for secondary school and secondary school are held until the end of June or the first days of July. In Italy, summer holidays include not only schools, but also shops and companies, most of which are closed for two weeks during August 15 (Ferragosto). Jamaica In Jamaica, summer holidays in primary and secondary schools begin in the first week of July and end in the first week of September, giving a duration of about eight weeks. Higher education institutions using the semester system usually have summer holidays, starting in May (at the end of exams) and ending in early September. However, this can vary from institution to agency. Japan In Japan, summer vacations usually last from late July to early September, and because of the way education in Japan is structured, this happens during the school year. Jordan In Jordan, the summer vacation lasts almost 3 months and most schools take summer holidays from mid-June to mid-September. Kuwait In Kuwait, summer holidays for primary and secondary schools (from 1st to 9th grade) start in late May or early June and end in early to late September, sometimes in early October (public schools). For high school students (from 10th to 12th grade) it starts from June 19 to 20 and ends simultaneously with elementary and secondary schools. Latvia In Latvia, the summer holidays last 3 months. From June 1 to August 31, the new school year begins the next day. Lebanon In Lebanon, the summer vacation lasts almost 3 months, and most schools take summer holidays from mid-June to early to mid-September. Libya In Libya, summer holidays last from early or mid-June to mid-September (3 months - 14 weeks). There are 5 more small holidays: a two-week mid-year break in February and two hijras of the lunar calendar 3 days of religious breaks for Eid Fit (June 15, 2018) and Eid Adha (August 22, 2018). Lithuania In Lithuania, summer holidays begin on the 15th school day of June (e.g. June 21) and end on September 1 with the start of the new school year (2.5 months). Luxembourg In Luxembourg, summer holidays start on July 16 and end on September 15 and last a total of two months. There are 5 more small holidays: All Saints' Day (1 week), Christmas (2 weeks), Carnival (1 week), Easter (2 weeks), Pentecost (1 week). (See also holidays in Luxembourg) Northern Macedonia In Northern Macedonia, summer holidays begin on June 10 and ends on September 1 at each school. They also get a Christmas break from December 31 to January 21, and a one-week break for Easter. Malta Malta, summer holidays usually last from the end of June to the end of September (3 months). Moldova In Moldova, summer holidays start on June 1 and end on September 1 (3 months). Morocco In Morocco, summer holidays last from June 20 to early September (2 months). Mexico In Mexico, summer holidays begin in early July and end in mid-August from 2000. However, high school students (10-12 grades) and college students have basically three months of vacation: from late May or early June to early August. Mongolia Summer holidays usually start from late May or early June (depending on schools) to the end of August. The academic year is divided into 4 semesters (each lasting from 8 to 9 weeks), and students take 1 week from the first and second semesters and 2 weeks after the third semester. Nepal In Nepal, summer holidays last from late May to the end of July. Netherlands In the Netherlands, the summer vacation is about 6 weeks for primary school and high school, usually from mid-July to the end of August. Schoolchildren officially get the same time, but often have a one week period before vacation, during which the student will only go to school for 2 days to get their class lists and return their books, making the holiday 7 weeks unofficially for high school students. However, this does not apply to every school. The School holidays (the term used rather than vacation) usually start in mid-December and end in late January or early February, which is usually 6-7 weeks. High school students 11, 12 and 13 years old finish their studies at the end of October, and their summer vacations begin after the last exam, which differs depending on the subject they take. All exams are completed by the end of November or early December. University or polytechnic students do not start until mid-February or early March and graduate in late October or mid-November. Nigeria In Nigeria, primary and secondary schools usually begin summer holidays in mid-July and resume in the first weeks of September. Vacation is also known as third term leave, and it is the longest break in the school year (usually up to two months). The first period of the break begins from one to two weeks before Christmas and ends the first or second week in January, lasting about three weeks. The first term break is usually the shortest break in the school year. The second term break usually begins a week before Easter and lasts another three weeks. This gives a total of about 14 weeks of vacation per year. The geographical location of the school is also a factor. Higher education institutions follow a different pattern, since the holiday in each school depends on different factors, which include the course of study and the academic calendar of the school. Some higher education institutions are monitoring breaks in the normal summer period, when primary and secondary schools are watching them, while others do not. Some courses also do not include any significant holidays, such programs include engineering, nursing, medicine and some others. This is usually the result of students doing their lab work, workshop practices, practices, internships, etc. (as it may be), while other students in other programs are on vacation. Higher education institutions observe two semesters; while some schools are watching a break after the first semester, many others have their breaks combined only with the summer holidays. This long break helps students get a good job during the holiday. The total duration of the break observed in higher education during the year is between 12 and 14 weeks. Norway In Norway, summer holidays usually last from mid-June to mid-August for at least 8 weeks. Oman In Oman, summer holidays begin at the end of May and end in early September (3 months). Pakistan In Pakistan, summer holidays last from two to three months, depending on the type of school (public or private). Typical summer holidays from late May to mid-August. Many private schools are also open in June and July for grades 8-10, and schools call summer programs summer camps. However, this is a contentious issue between public and private schools. Palestine In Palestine, the summer holidays last about two months. Summer holidays begin at the end of June and end in early September. Panama In Panama, summer holidays begin in early December for both public and private schools and end at the end of February (3 months). Paraguay In Paraguay, summer holidays begin in December and end at the end of February (2 months). Philippines In the Philippines, summer holidays in kindergartens, primary and secondary schools usually begin in the third week of March and end in the first to third week of June. This coincides with the tropical dry season in the country from March to June. Colleges and universities, however, offer summer classes for students who want to take advanced subjects or those who do not pass the prerequisites for the next school year. The school year begins in the first week of June, at the beginning of the rainy season in the Philippines. Individual universities have adapted the curriculum of other countries' academic years, starting the academic year in September and having summer holidays from June to August. Some of the schools that performed are still in transition, their academic calendars still begin in July, others in August, with their summer vacations appropriately adjusted. Poland In Poland, summer holidays begin on the first Saturday after June 20 and end on the first weekday of September, except Or Saturdays. Portugal In Portugal, summer holidays start in mid-June and end in mid-September. In Russia, summer holidays start on May 25 ending the old school year (for 1-8th and 10th grades) and ending on September 1 with the start of the new school year. For the 9th and 11th grades, in connection with the exams (EGE), the holidays begin in the middle (9th grade) or at the end of (11th grade) June. Romania In Romania, summer holidays usually start on June 14 and end on the second Sunday in September (3 months). For 8th grade, it starts a week earlier than the official summer vacation date this year, and two weeks early for 12th grade. Summer holidays in Saint Lucia begin in early July and end on the first Monday in September (8 weeks). Saudi Arabia Summer Vacations for Saudi Students are usually in late May to mid-September, depending on the time of Ramadan. Serbia In Serbia, summer vacations begin around the end of June, or rather, by the end of the 2nd or 3rd week of June. Summer holidays end on August 31. The school officially begins on the first working day of September (if September 1 is Saturday or Sunday, the beginning of school is postponed until Monday). Slovakia In Slovakia, summer holidays last from July 1 to September 1 (2 months and Constitution Day). Slovenia In Slovenia, final exams are usually taken from mid-May to mid-June (secondary schools) or in June (primary schools). The last day at the school is June 24, and the school resumes on September 1. The winter break lasts from mid-June to early July, and there are 10 days of Easter holidays. Summer holidays begin at the end of July and end in mid-August. Summer holidays in South Korea's Pyeongchang take place during the school year. Summer holidays start on December 20 and end on March 19. Spain In Spain the school year ends in mid or late June and starts in mid-September. Rest varies by region, but often includes family vacations to reduce temperatures in cooler regions in northern Spain, or in the south or east to Mediterranean beaches. Suriname in Suriname, summer holidays usually start in mid-August and end in early October. In 2012, several legislators proposed changing the summer holidays at the same time as the Caribbean community. The proposed plan is that summer holidays start in mid-August and end in early October. Sweden In Sweden, summer holidays between the spring and autumn semesters. It usually lasts about 10 weeks, from a week to mid-summer and ending in mid-August (usually in the 8th week after midsummer). In Sweden, students finish their term, either at church or at their school, singing traditional summer songs like Den blomsterid nude commercial (usually only the first two verses). Switzerland In Switzerland summer holidays vary in each canton. For example, in zurich five weeks and between mid-July and mid-August. In Ticino it lasts about ten weeks from the end of June to the beginning of September. Syria In Syria summer holidays last 3 months. It starts in mid-June (for primary and secondary schools) and ends in mid-September. University students rest from the beginning of July to the beginning of October. It depends on 2 or 3 days depending on the school or year. Medium-term leave tends to last a week. Taiwan In Taiwan summer holidays begin in early July (end of June for university students) and end in late August (mid-September for university students). Thailand In Thailand summer holidays start in late February - early March and end in mid-May. The primary and secondary schools of Trinidad and Tobago close on the first Friday in July and open on the first Monday in September (gives students two months). This can vary in a day or two depending on the school or year. International schools are linked to British, Canadian or American systems. Turkey In Turkey, summer holidays start in mid-June and end in mid-September (3 months). Tunisia In Tunisia, summer holidays in high school (7-9th grade) and high school start on May 30 and end on September 15. Elementary schools go on leave on June 1 and end on September 15. The United Arab Emirates Summer Vacation officially begins in early July. All schools in the UAE are closed in July and August. All public and private sectors and schools have two days on weekends on Fridays and Saturdays. The Office of Human Development (KHDA) is also issuing festive upgrades to private schools in Dubai. July 2 will be the last school day for students this academic year, students will receive a seven-week break during the summer, a three-week break in winter, and a two-week break for spring. In England and Wales, summer holidays in public schools usually last from the second week of July to early September, which gives a duration of six or seven weeks. In Scotland, school summer holidays start at the end of June and last about six to seven weeks, with most schools returning around mid-August. However, it is not uncommon for some schools in recent years to finish in the first week of July. In Northern Ireland, most school summer holidays start at the end of June and last until early September. Students with exams (GCSEs and A-Levels) often take a school leave from May and take exams sometime this month or early June. In the United Kingdom, holiday dates for independent schools are largely different from those of public schools; these differences usually take the form of an additional week's leave at the beginning and end of each of the long holidays, i.e. four weeks for the Christmas and Easter holidays and eight to ten weeks for the summer holidays, although changes in the length of summer holidays exist between independent schools themselves. Summer Summer the break is determined by a break in state exams at the end of May. Some universities give extended exam leave for students, which usually starts in early April, in order to give students a large number of weeks to prepare for the summer exam season, which usually starts in mid-to-late May and ends in early or mid-June. Students in the final year of independent schools usually finish their time at school when their last exam ends in the summer exam season, and as an encore; A special event is usually organized at the end of June by the school for vacationers and staff as a way of providing an opportunity for a final farewell to be a bid. The universities they go on to typically plan their first term to start in early-October, giving school leavers an extended summer leaver between their time leaving school and starting university. United States Dates vary by location of the school district, but usually follow the same schedules; Most schools in the northeastern United States end in June and begin on Wednesday after Labor Day (the first Monday in September, with teachers reporting as early as Tuesday), while most schools in the southern United States schools end in May and start again in August. Although the origins of the summer holidays are believed to be rooted in agriculture, the idea that children need to assist in planting and harvesting is inaccurate. Most of the crops were planted in the spring and harvested in autumn. The modern school calendar is rooted in the 19th-century school reform movement, which seeks to standardize between urban and rural areas. Up until the mid-1800s, most schools were open for the winter and summer. As individual schools merged into school districts and bureaucracies emerged to manage newly formed school districts, school leaders and policy makers identified the need to standardize calendars across regions. This standardization was associated with emerging tax structures, compulsory education laws, and the general view that school should be an important component of American childhood. Because the calendar was standardized in different regions, school leaders received signals from a variety of factors, including attendance and difficulty cooling school buildings. Many upper-class families left the city during the hot summer months, and as such, schools canceled their summer sessions due to low daily attendance. As train travel became more accessible, middle-class families followed similar patterns, keeping their children at home during the hottest months of the year or leaving for the summer holidays. In addition to the heat and Many school leaders advocated for breaks so students and teachers could rest their brains. Many American educators of the 19th and early 20th century believed that many learning was bad for one's health and could result in injury, particularly for younger children, whose minds were still developing. The long summer holidays have been seen as a way for children and their teachers to relax and recover. In many places, teachers will use the summer months for their own training and professional development, including participation in seminars and courses like those held at Chautauquua. Uruguay In Uruguay, summer holidays usually start in early December and end in early March (3 months). Venezuela In Venezuela, summer holidays start in early July and end in late September or early October. Vietnam In Vietnam summer holidays usually start in late May or early June and last two months.
