FACING DEATH

Our parish has experienced many funerals lately. John Gerhard was a pastor in the 17th century. His parish saw many births and baptisms, but many deaths also through war and the plague. Death and funerals were a regular part of his ministry.



I thought that his month I would share with you one of his meditations on death from his Manual of Comfort for the Severely III (*Enchiridion consolatorium oder Tröstliches Handbüchlein Johann Gerhard's wider den Tod und die Anfechtungen beim Todeskampfe*).

"The afflicted person says: 'My illness could be terminal. I know I am mortal anyway. But this life seems sweet. This world still seems beautiful. The only life I know is this life in this body.'

The comforter says: 'God created you, not for this poor, short life, but for everlasting life. God created Adam and Eve, our first parents, to live forever'.

You were redeemed by Christ not for this hard life but for that blessed life waiting for you in heaven. 'This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners.' (1 Tim. 3:15).

Through the Gospel the Holy Spirit has called you into Christ's kingdom, not to be happy for a little while on earth, but to move one day from the kingdom of grace to the kingdom of glory, from the church militant to the church triumphant, from the vale of tears to the land of joy.

If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable' (1Cor. 15:19). If you are soon to be led through the door of death into the life for which the Father created you, the Son redeemed you, and the Holy Spirit called you, do not reject the gracious will of God toward you (Luke 7:30). If God is calling you, follow with joy!"

This little meditation calls us to change our perspective on death and on this life. This life is only a short part of our journey. And the church militant, the church on this side of eternity is the minority! The multitude of believers that have passed on, have passed to the Church triumphant. And this Church triumphant will remain forever while the church militant will end in Christ coming back in glory to establish the eternal kingdom. And remember, we are surrounded by a cloud of innumerable angels and witnesses who have attained perfection (Hebrews 12:22-24). They are watching us and supporting us with their prayers.

A message from the Director of Finance ...

Effective September 2019, FaithLife will no longer process automatic withdrawals for congregants who use this mode to contribute to the church monthly. We have switched to EFT Canada for this service.

The system was tested successfully in August with a new donor who signed up recently but was not in the FaithLife database.

We expect that all 13 donors will see the withdrawals from EFT Canada on September 20, 2019 and every month after that until they choose to cancel.

Please consider signing up. It helps avoid the temptation of using the money marked for giving used for other purposes when one does not attend church regularly. It also helps us to manage the finances of the church when a predictable cash input is available.

The Living Way Bible Study group will be meeting again this year on Tuesday mornings in Luther Hall. We welcome you to join us for a morning of sharing God's word and our faith, and fellowship. Coffee and tea are available and our sessions are 11/2 to 2 hours in length.

Our study for this year is called "*Great People of* the Old Testament". In his introduction to this study, Rev. Martin E. Mayer writes "The purpose of the Old Testament is to tell us the story of God's chosen people and how He directed the course of their history until His promise, first given to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden (Genesis 3:15), could be fulfilled and the **Saviour**, who would redeem the world from sin, could come into the world. This makes these writings vitally important, for they speak constantly of this coming **Saviour**, the Messiah.

Another important consideration is that we are dealing today with the same God who was involved in the lives of the people of the Old Testament. Our God is **unchangeable** (Malachi 3:6; Psalm 102:27). What a comfort that is for us! The gracious manner in which God dealt with these people is the same way He deals with people today. Everything written about Him and His relationship with man is applicable to our day.

Another thing to be considered is how God arranged for us to have the story of the lives of these great people of the Old Testament recorded so that we might **learn from them.** As we examine these people, we will discover that they are very much like us. Since they were successful in both their earthly lives and in their relationship with God, there is much to be learned from them."

Living Way Bible Studies are written and/or edited by LCMS pastors and emphasize practical application to our daily lives and present the Bible as the holy, inspired and inerrant Word of God. The weekly lessons provide opportunity for personal home study (questions from the text), small group sharing (questions and answers), and additional insight from the author's notes on each lesson.

Our first meeting on **Tuesday, September 17**, will be a time to reconnect with friends and welcome newcomers, as well as pick up our materials for the "Great People of the Old Testament" study.
