As a member of the K-12 school's steering team, the curriculum coordinators oversee compliance with teaching standards and school curricula. These teachers choose the curriculum, work with teachers and school leaders to implement the curriculum and evaluate its effectiveness in the school. They also plan and coordinate training conferences for teachers as well as mentors and teacher-trainers. Some curriculum coordinators serve in the general school, while others specialize in the same area of study, such as reading and literacy. State and municipal financial assistance to individual states and cities supports public education by offering grants, scholarships and incentives for education students. Illinois also offers a teacher loan repayment program. Teach Grant Graduates in Education can receive up to \$8,000 from the U.S. government thanks to the TEACH Grant. This award is not a grant based on necessity. Instead, grant recipients must teach for at least four years in a high-need area in a low-income school, and maintain 3.25 GPA or higher. Private Scholarships Future Teachers can apply for private funds through scholarships established by foundations and other private organizations. Scholarships vary in both amount and qualifications.
