In the film, a traumatized mercenary named Joe (Phoenix) is hired by a politician to find and rescue his daughter, who was kidnapped by a human trafficking network, which Joe is instructed to destroy by any violent means. The unfinished version of the film took place at the 2017 Cannes Film Festival in a competition where Ramsay won the prize for best screenplay and Phoenix for Best Actor. The film was released by Studio Canal in the UK, March 9, 2018, and Amazon Studios in the U.S., where it began limited release in Los Angeles and New York on April 6, 2018, and a wide release on April 20. He received critical acclaim. Plot Joe is traumatized by a hired gun that saves girls who are victims of human trafficking, using brutal methods against their captors. He takes care of his elderly mother at his childhood home in New York. Joe has memories of the abuse he and his mother faced with his abusive father, and his brutal past in the army and FBI, and is concerned about suicidal thoughts. When he comes home one night, Joe is treated to Moises, the son of An Angel, who acts as a mediator between Joe and his handler John McCleary. Joe tells McCleary that Angel knows his address and could pose a security risk. McCleary appoints Joe to a new job: New York State Senator Albert Votto offered a large sum of money to discreetly save his kidnapped daughter Nina. He gives Joe a brothel address for wealthy patrons, sent through anonymous text. Joe puts out of the brothel, kills several guards and patrons, and rescues Nina. While Joe and Nina are waiting for Votto's arrival in the hotel room, news reports say that Votto committed suicide. Police officers gain access to the room using the clerk's desk before killing the clerk and taking One of the officers tries to kill Joe, but instead killed Joe, who then escapes. Joe believes that government agents killed McCleary, Angel and Moises, in search of Joe's address. Returning to his house, Joe discovers that two agents killed his mother and waited for him. He kills one agent and fatally injures another, which shows that Governor Williams is directing authorities to cover up human trafficking, and that Nina is Williams' favorite. Joe gives his mother a water burial. He fills his pockets with stones and allows himself to sink into the water with the intention of resting, but as he sinks, he has a vision of Nina; he removes the stones from his pockets and swims back to the surface. Joe follows Williams to his country house and fights his way, only to discover Williams with her throat slit. He searches the house and finds Nina, sitting at the dinner table, next to a bloody straight razor. Although Joe is upset to see that Nina killed Williams, Nina assures him that she is all right. Later, sitting in a diner, Joe has a violent suicidal fantasy and loses aside. Nina wakes him up, saying: It's a beautiful day. He agrees, and they leave together. It has been reported that Lynn Ramsay will write and direct an adaptation of Jonathan Ames's novella You've Never Been Here, starring Joaquin Phoenix. The project will be shopping for Cannes shoppers. Although it was initially reported that A24 acquired the project, Amazon Studios bought the U.S. rights to You Were Never Really Here on May 13, 2016. The main photo took place in August 2016 in New York and its district. Some of the internal scenes were filmed at Kaufman Astoria Studios. On May 2, 2017, it was confirmed that the film will be scored by composer Johnny Greenwood. The film was still in the process of being developed when it premiered at the Cannes Film Festival on May 27, 2017. Phoenix's Critical Response reception and Ramsay's leadership received praise from critics at the Cannes Film Festival. Phoenix won the award for Best Actor at the Festival, and Ramsay won the prize for best screenplay. On Rotten Tomatoes, the film has an approval rating of 89% based on 266 reviews, with an average rating of 8.18/10. The critical consensus of the website states: Bracingly elevated, usually a committed lead performance from Joaquin Phoenix, you've never been here confirms writer-director Lynn Ramsay as one of the most unique contemporary film-and- uncompromising-voices. On Metacritic the film has a weighted average score of the 100 based on 41 criticisms, which is a sign of universal recognition. Sheila O'Malley of RogerEbert.com gave the film four out of four stars, saying the film is stretched and almost unbearably intense 90 minutes, with no ounce of fat on it. Guy Lodge for Variety said Ramsay could be the greatest working director in the world and called the film amazing... sharply, sinewy, shortened to the bone of a hit thriller much more preoccupied with a man than a hit. Some noted similarities to You Were Never Really Here and the 1976 film Taxi Driver with both films related to the friendship between an adult man and a child victim of prostitution and the study of the run-down underworld of New York.
