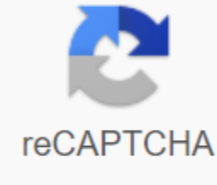




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## Colonna capper parts

More information More Info Demo Instructions No Related Messages I have Colonna capper/Corker, and when I cover my standard beer bottles, it leaves 2 ridges proud as they slide into the capper bell slots. Then I need to turn the bottle a bit and make another pass and it pushes 2 high ridges down and it looks better. Has anyone else had such problems? It can with 2 bells and a cork pusher, so it doesn't look like anything is missing. I think I got a bum bell, and could order another one. I got it as a gift, so not sure where it was purchased, or where I could get spare parts. You can find a capper/corker online, but haven't found a vendor for the parts. Any ideas? I have a capper/corker and a smaller capper-only model. I had a capper/corker longer and basically used it to block Belgian bottles. I recently inherited a capper only and used it quite a bit. I haven't experienced the question you've described either, so I'd suggest it's a bad bell as well. Do you see any defect/deformation in the bell? As for the parts, I couldn't find. The capper just that I inherited came with a nylon/plastic C-clip where the handle attached to a plunger arm (capper/corker uses a plastic threaded nut, so I think it might be an old design). I pulled the c-clip off to adjust the handle to my liking, and the C-clip cracked in half. I was looking for a replacement that worked, but I couldn't find it. I ended up making one of a piece of nylon leaf I bought on Amazon. Maybe homegrown stores can order spare parts? If everything else fails, you could make some kind of fastening and put a winged bell capper there. It's really quite an awesome capper. I use mine all the time and just keep my winged one around as a backup. I bought a Colonna bench capper ( about 2 months ago and it worked great. Recently, my roommate and I moved out of our house and while moving in, a C-clip popped up and the thing fell apart. We found a pen and a c-clip, but completely lost the part that actually caps the bottle. Is there any buy this part and not spend another \$40 on a new capper? I can't find any websites where possible, although my Google-fu may be a bit weak. Weak. Weak.

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
