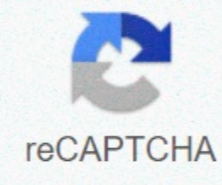

If you are young, you can probably repay. On the other hand, classes are large (somewhere around 300 students per semester). I read about crowded classrooms, some classes are squeezed into labs on Saturday b/c overcrowding. You will do well in a large class with little or no personal attention. I bet it's also somewhat cut-throat (competitive). Also the location is far away - outside of South America! The heard device is not as good as the AUC. 2. AUC is cheaper. The location is much better (Maarten Street). The facilities are supposed to be state-of-the-art (Americanized). The size of the class varies from 70 to 170 per semester in terms of entry of students coming into the program. Had an amazing (very impressive) open day in Newark, NJ. The rent is affordable, although for first semester classes you will need to live on campus for either \$1800 per semester for a dormitory or between \$2200 and \$3250 for a single room. After the first semester, fully furnished houses start at around \$500 for a studio/apartment with one bedroom and \$1200-\$1500 for a 3-4 bedroom house. A different culture.
