



Do you want to make where you live better? Become a “Neighborhood Ambassador.”

Sign-up to become a Neighborhood Ambassador at www.NationalGoodNeighborDay.com. Becoming a “Neighborhood Ambassador” is a volunteer role to serve your community and neighborhood. We ask for a two-year commitment.

Here is the five-step process for training to be a “Neighborhood Ambassador” as part of Better Neighboring and National Good Neighbor Day.

1. Sign the “Good Neighbor Pledge” at www.NationalGoodNeighborDay.com
2. Attend the 45 minute “Good Neighbor Workshop” that helps you learn the good neighbor mindset and how to be proactive as a good neighbor in your community.
3. Attend the monthly “Good Neighbor Forum” where community leaders from across the country gather on Zoom to share insights and ideas on how to be better at neighboring.
4. Read the monthly “Better Neighboring” email newsletter providing you the latest resources and information to help you make where you live better.
5. Your “Neighborhood Ambassador” role will be confirmed by receiving a letter of credence and an invitation for a ceremonial recognition during a “Good Neighbor Forum” on Zoom.

The primary function of the “Neighborhood Ambassador” program involves the following five purposes:

1. *Celebrate National Good Neighbor Day* in your community by promoting do-it-yourself ways neighbors can introduce themselves to others and practice the good neighbor mindset.
2. *Host neighborhood gatherings* in your community throughout the year where neighbors are invited to something fun such as a block party, neighborhood walk, or holiday event.
3. *Organize a “Good Neighbor Serve Day”* where neighbors come together to help with a project that improves their community or serve someone within their neighborhood who needs help with a special project. When neighbors come together to serve they discover how life is better and stronger together.
4. *Represent your neighborhood* to your local city and community leaders and/or home owner’s association. You can become a voice and ambassador on behalf of the concerns and needs of your area to help serve neighbors better and promote togetherness and connectivity with one another.
5. *Share resources and tips* made available to you from BetterNeighboring.com with your neighbors through social media and email. You can help educate and promote better neighboring as people discover it does not have to be complicated, but we do have to be intentional and proactive.
