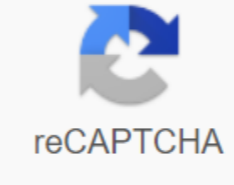

The mess provides these tiny creatures with a place to hide. If you don't clean up the mess before you start, you'll manage the bugs in the mess, creating a big problem. Day 2Start in the bedroom, go to residential areas, and tackle closets. Pull all the furniture away from the walls. Remove the bedding. Wash the following items and dry on high heat: sheets, pillowcases, blankets, bed skirts and other linens. Remove the curtains. Empty Dressers.Wash all fabric, and dry on high. Take apart the bed frame. Use a wire brush to wash any areas that you suspect are bed bugs and eggs. (This can damage furniture, so you may need to use another method, such as steaming) Scrub any suspected areas with window cleaners or liquid oxygen products to loosen the eggs. Oxyclean is a good choice. Clean the room, including windows, cracks and crevices. These products are usually an ammonia base that kills bed bugs and eggs. (Don't use direct ammonia, it's a dangerous product, especially for asthmatics) Carefully vacuum everything! (Remove the vacuum bag immediately, place in a zippered lock and dispose of the bag, otherwise the bugs will escape from the vacuum.) Throw away all the furniture you're going to throw away at this point. Some furniture can be saved using mattress and sofa protectors. Day 3Clean carpets in the bedroom and living room, or remove it. If you have a steamer, steam everything for now. (Not windows in winter, they can crack) Day 4Apply bed bug killer according to the package direction. For Hot Shot Products: Perimeter spray, cracked, grounded boards, inside dressers and so on, and then fog. For diatom land: in cracks and crevices and anywhere the bed meets the floor. For sprays you mix yourself: a perimeter spray, and a mattress (if approved for this), base boards, crack slits, inside dressers and so on. Immediately put on the mattress and pillows on mattresses and pillows. Keep the duck tape handy at all times. You will need to check the lid cover and duck tape any areas. You want this mattress sealed tightly, so that any bugs inside will die rather than escape. Place the bug bed traps on or under the bed frame and mattress. Even professional fighter jets require compliance with a certain timeline. When choosing a professional, expect them to be clear about your responsibilities. If they can't do it, it's a red flag. If you do well the graphics, then this will be the easy part. Clear two weeks of the calendar (go to work, but take the time to process). I believe that the proper process of destroying the bug bed can be done in about two weeks. But preventing re-infection can lead to lifestyle changes. Giving up public meetings, games and outs for weeks is worth it. There must be at least two people involved and each of them should devote time every day. If you can't devote time to this process, you're better off with a professional. I'm not trying to talk you out of it on my own; I just want to impress the importance of getting ready. The schedule here takes 18 days, but most of the work in the first two weeks. If you draw the process for too long, you run the risk of bed bugs being driven into areas that you can't even understand are a problem. Dedicating this project will be your true relief. Some people may spend a lot less time than two weeks, although there should be a second spray two weeks after the first. Others should spend more than two weeks. I shortened the steps to days; however, you have to change what needs to be done when, according to your own situation. Again, this list can be printed if you want a printed copy to check how you go. Expected resultsIf you follow this plan, you should be bed bug free by the end of the second week, or almost. If you miss the steps, you'll most likely have to start over. As you can see, it's a long and arduous process, so if you can't make every move, call a professional. Remember that sealing is optional and should be done carefully, more on this here. If you still have bed bugs after that, call a professional. The questions and answers: Do you have to seal computers, TVs or refrigerators when fogging for bugs and fleas? Answer: No. Never try to seal the appliances. If you do this, you will die the device itself. Remember that most electronics get very warm. Bed bugs don't want to invade them unless they have any other choice. If your attempt to drive them away has driven them into these appliances, they won't stay there very long before the heat gets too high. Again, never print your appliances or electronics. The question is: What is the responsibility of the landlord to bed the bug infestation? Bedbugs don't eat daily. Some eat only every 5 to 10 days. There are plenty of enough babies to keep the waves of them coming on. Most are resistant to poisons, and this effort takes MUCH TIME (not 18 days, as the original poster suggests, rolling your eyes) and the effort should be almost daily between vacuuming, poison, dust cymexa, as diatomaceous earth does not work, washing and drying all daily, etc. ANY READING THIS, do not miss the diatoomasate of the earth. It's horribly messy, impossible 100% remove again, ruins your vacuums, swims around the house and gets into your lungs, dries your hair, and has a faint ecstoid smell to it that's hard to get rid of. I still smell when I get home, now built into the carpet and sofa, and I'll have to get rid of these things because the dust just doesn't quite ever come back again. Should you get diatomaceous land WET? that a mess, it becomes a yellow putty. I am deeply clear that I have ever used diatomaceous land, and would like to drop my previous advice that anyone would use it. WASTE time, and destroys your home. I still find that dust everywhere. Cymexa dust works like bags and storage all in bags lined with poison, Cyonara, BEdlam, I used them all, so I'm not sure which one did the trick, but, I think it was constantly vacuuming and spraying poison and drying everything. I used a hairdryer on furniture, too.plugging all the sockets, butskip diatomateous dust of the earth, sorry I knew that even when I first started this battle. Can anyone give me a ball park figure of what it would cost to hire one?My Name WasAlreadytaken on October 18, 2019: Great list, a few updates. All the DIY extenimators I've talked to are buying my poison, say spray every 5 to 7 days, not every 14 or 18 days. They emphasize that it is very important to get headwinds of newly hatched bugs every 5 to 7 days. I think 18 days is optimistic, especially if one is working full time. I thought we should wash, dry in the dryer x 45 minutes and then bag all the clothes. I thought we should keep it in the bags until we're sure the bugs are gone. So, these are LOTTA bags. I spent probably \$50 on garbage bags alone, just for clothes and other items. I use bags so I could find my clothes easier. You want FLAP_Tie bags rather than pull a string of sorts, so you you you tie it snugly tightly. I use different color bags to sort out which items still don't wash, which are made, which are not even clothes. haha-----Also, do your CAR. I parked my car in a safe place so I could watch it, and turned the heat wayyyyyyyy way to a full blast, and left the heat for x 8 hours, every day x 2 days (I used 1/4 tank) and then, I repeat it once a week x 4 weeks. Just to be sure. Bedbugs die at 120 degrees in just an hour or two, but even just 90s or 100 for many hours will also kill them. Cuz is not waaaayy to spray every crack in the car. Nope I also securely, tightly bagging my books, securely, and stacking books in the machine, while heating my car x 8 hours a day to kill any bugs in my books. I used both poison spray and that D.E. powder (diatom ground), I filled my bed with this powder. I used mittens clips to keep my blanket from touching the floor (n case there was any error on the floor). I threw all my bedding into the EVery dryer the night x 45 minutes. I filled my mattress with D.E.earth poison and powder. At first I used a double stick tape on all the legs of my bed to prevent re-entry, but, overtime, D.E. powder removed any stickiness, so I switch to a wide, glitter tape-like error-sliding on this and couldn't stand up. I bought a powder puff and a bowl, and carefully applied D.E. powder for myself before going to bed. I wore a breathing mask using this powder. I also used D.E. powder-----to make, MAKE SPEED BUMPS on each doorway, and sprayed the entire door frame to help reduce the bugs moving the room into the room. I also put this dust in sockets, switches, and I sprayed the poison into all the vents. Even mini-blind shots. Also spray the backs of any item on the wall, they like to climb up. Also make ceiling joints. I sprayed all the shoes, and purses, and bags of them in case of bugs resist the spray. I powdered all the toys and pet items, bagged them, and then after the meltdown was over, I threw in the dryer to remove any powder or bugs still alive after that. Some items just have to stay bagged x 18 months before all the bugs survive as I can't get these things wet from the poison, nor covered with D.E.earth powder, either.
