Shed Update Happenings

The Roof: The roof is constructed with flat panels and in-between each panel a silicone was injected. Unfortunately this compound only has a life when in constant sunlight of around 15 years. It's use by date has long ago passed and consequently when it rained the water didn't stop at roof level and into the gutters but continued in torrents into the shed. So after many weeks of repair work by a roofing contractor the old silicon has been removed, new applied and then as a more permanent fix, a top-hat has been installed over each joint. And "yabba dabba doo" we now we have a dry shed.

More Needed Equipment for the workshop. With the sad closure of Crane Enfield which operated in Penrith for some many years, a lot of their equipment was sold via an on-line auction. A couple of members went and inspected what was on offer and identified two items, one being a very solid steel welders table complete with a massive vice and the other a three input dust extractor unit. We were successful on auction day to get both.



The bench was a bit too heavy for two to lift and eventually four managed to up-end it and get it onto the pallet lift. While the dust extractor will be cleaned up and repaired needed before being set up inside.

A wireless access point will be installed so that any weak spots at the back of the shed will also receive good reception. Yalumcwa: My wife and I were meet by a village elder who had arranged assistance and transport to take us to their village which was about 10 to 11 Km inland along a rough dusty pot hole infested track from the village where the cruise ship had anchored in the bay at Kiriwina Island



On arrival at Yalumcwa Village we had the most warmest welcome from the staff, students and families of Yalumcwa. The school Children preformed the



tradition welcoming greetings and other traditional songs and dancers and after unpacking your lovely gifts we had a tour of the school and village. Due to the tight time frame we only had a short time with the lovely people of Yalumcwa Village before we had to make our way back over the rough bush track to the cruise ship. On the journey back the vehicle had a puncher and the spare tyre was also flat from a previous puncher. The elders arranged for an other vehicle to come and take us the remaining distance to the ship.

Tools Explained

Band Saw: A large stationary power saw primarily used to cug good aluminium sheets into smaller pieces that more easily fit into the recycle bin after you cut on the inside of the line instead of the outside edge.

Phillips Screwdriver: Normally used to stab the vacuum seals under lids or for opening old-style paper/tin oil cans and splashing oil on your shirt; but can also be used, as the name implies, to strip out Phillips screw heads.

Straight Screwdriver: A tool for opening paint cans. Sometimes used to convert slotted screws into non-removable screws and butchering your palms.

Hose Cutter: A tool used to make hoses too short.
