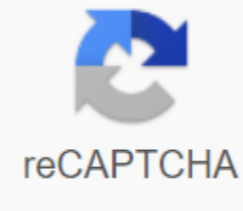

We wanted to feel connected to the outside world, Hill explains. When the breeze comes across the room, it just changes lives. She laughs, perhaps on and then doubles down. It really is! It's something for the soul. And we wanted it to be created in a way that when we brought people down, they'd get the same feeling that we got when we first came in, continues McGraw. Some pieces, such as an organic tree trunk table in a music hall and twine-bound Indonesian lanterns that hang over it, have been chosen to convey a bizarre, almost shipwrecked vibe. We wanted everyone to feel a little cobbled together, Booth says, as if you washed up on the beach and had to figure out a way to decorate the house.
