MINUTES:

Motion by Bill Thomas, seconded by Karleen DuMond to approve the March meeting minutes, all in favor, motion carried.

FLOORTIME:

1. Steve Tiska Informed the board that he notified the DOT with his concerns about the speed limit signs on Pine Hill and is waiting for their reply. Betty again told Steve that the anytime the board would like to make a motion the will take a vote on it at this time the board does not want to do this.
2. Angela Ellis said that she heard that Delaware County gives the Town of Masonville \$5000 for a recreation program and Angela is asking where that money goes. Betty states that she is not aware of this and will look into it further. Years ago the State have us money and over time they cut the money, until there was nothing. The town does give Sidney Recreation Program \$2,750 this goes for the cost of

having our children included in sports in Sidney and for the pool maintenance. Angela would like to see some kind of play area for our children.

- Betty asked Angela if she would like to dig into this playground idea deeper and be the representative for us, she agreed. There are many things to look at, like where would it be?

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT REPORT:

- Plow and sand roads as needed.
- Cleaned up trees from a couple of windstorms.
- Christmas flooding of 2020 damage repaired at most locations.
- Sweeping roads.
- Hauled in winter sand.
- Receiving stone for paving projects.
- Truck and equipment service and repairs made.
- Fixed welcome to Masonville sign near Parker Hollow Road, down from windstorm.
- Replaced Hering Rd sign and Seasonal Rd sign on Mormon Hollow Rd.
- The 2008 plow truck is almost completed, should see it by the end of April.
- Called Apline of snow stop damage, they came out and fixed the damage free of charge, normally Mother Nature is not covered under warranty.
- Had 5 contractors interested in the sidewalk project.
- Specs on new 10-wheeler plow truck almost complete.

Steve Roff asked Chuck where we are at with the break room; Chuck said the sheet rock guy is not showing up. Steve suggested we hire someone to finish it and paint the salt shed that the highway guys were supposed to paint last year.

Jeri asked if the seasonal road sign on Mormon Hollow should be moved. A stop sign needs to be put up at the turn around on Mormon Hollow Rd there is no place for the plow truck to turn around if someone is parked there.

We tabled the trees in the cemetery at this time.

- With the grant from the court, we will have Delhi Telephone install cameras inside and outside and they will have a remote backup so they can be viewed off site.

- We are going to see if the Adirondack Trail will be willing to take over the bridge on Church St.

Only received one bid for the sidewalk. The bid is more than we have to spend from the grant. Chuck will contact them and see what the cost would be to do just the part from Church St to at least the bridge.
