MINUTES:

Motion by Bill Thomas, seconded by Steve Tiska to approve the June meeting minutes, all in favor, motion carried.

FLOORTIME:

1. Steve Tiska is still asking for road signs and discussing the liability to the Town. Steve also asked Chuck more questions about the signs.
2. Angela gave us an update on the park. Trees have been trimmed; bleachers will be in next week. The blacktop repair has gone out for bid. We can begin the nature trail; Angela contacted the boy scouts about helping to get their badges. We missed the deadline for the grant. HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT REPORT:

- Patching potholes
- Roadside mowing 75% complete
- Graded Steam Mill Rd
- Cleaned up several trees from wind storm
- Helped Towns of Sidney and Deposit pave
- Helped Towns of Unadilla and Afton oil and stone
- Received millings off the Route 8 job to be used on Beals Pond Rd
- Received 500 gallons of waste oil for the shop heat
- Picked up truck #4 from the frame shop, works great so far
- Preparing our roads to be paved in July

OLD BUSINESS:

- We need to put a down payment on the new truck to get it ordered. We will need to do a Bond for it but not for around a year, as that is the lead-time to get the truck. It takes around 3 months to get the Bond completed.

Chuck would like to purchase the Kenworth as the International has obsolete parts. Steve Roff expressed that they need a complete bid for everything before the board will approve the purchase. Chuck will obtain the bid for the next meeting.

- Steve Roff asked why there are not decals on all of the trucks yet. Chuck said he would get them ordered.
- No News yet on the Finger lakes trail taking over the Church St Bridge.
- No news on the Cemetery tree removal. No one calls back about doing the job.
- Sidewalks Mid to end of August for construction.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Chuck to call NYSEG about the street light that is out on from of Mark Garcon’s house. Chuck said some towns are switching to LED bulbs and he will talk about this with NYSEG.
- America rescue recovery fund will be giving our town \$125,743 in grant money, this money can only be used to COVID related damages and expenses. We will have until 2025 to spend this money; the money will be put in a separate account. It could possibly be used for some of the following:
 - Wages
 - PPE Equipment
 - Website
 - Computers
 - Ground water quality
 - Culverts replaced
 - Possibly the salt shed roof repair
