Bible, Tradition, and Magisterium: The Three Pillars of the Divine Revelation.

Bible, Tradition, and Magisterium: The Three Pillars of the Church. Many non-Catholic Christian denominations profess "sola scriptura," as the sole means for access to Divine Revelation. However, we as Catholic Christians propose three pillars as sources for understanding Divine Revelation: Bible, Tradition, and Magisterium. The written text is the fruit of an oral tradition that tells us about the existence of a divine reality revealed to humanity: "Jesus did many other things; if they were all written down, I suppose there would not be room in the world for so many books" (Jn 21:25). This means that not everything Jesus said is contained in the Gospels, and that is precisely what we know in the Church as Oral Tradition, that is, the preaching or elements that have been transmitted from the earliest Christian community to the present day. Speaking on this topic in his Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation *Verbum Domini*, on the Word of God in the life and mission of the Church, Pope Benedict XVI, wrote: "Ultimately, it is the living Tradition of the Church that enables us to adequately understand Sacred Scripture as the Word of God."

We can say that Tradition and Sacred Scripture are like two channels through which we have access to Divine Revelation. Revelation is one, but it reaches us in a complementary way through two channels: Tradition and Scripture, which are in reality one and the same, the living word that is transmitted, and which at specific times the Church decides to put into writing. It is important to know that the entire People of God receive this Tradition and Scripture through prayer, the sacraments, and through apostolic doctrine, which we are called to preserve, profess, and practice.

Now, the Church in its Dogmatic Constitution *Dei Verbum* on Divine Revelation of the Second Vatican Council teaches us that "the office of authentically interpreting the written or transmitted word of God has been entrusted solely to the living Magisterium of the Church, whose authority is exercised in the name of Jesus Christ. This Magisterium, evidently, does not stand above the word of God, but serves it, teaching only what has been entrusted to it, by divine command and with the assistance of the Holy Spirit, it hears it with piety, guards it with exactitude and expounds it faithfully, and from this one deposit of faith it draws all that it proposes as truth revealed by God to be believed. It is evident, therefore, that Sacred Tradition, Sacred Scripture and the Magisterium of the Church, according to the most wise plan of God, are intertwined and united in such a way that one cannot exist without the other, and that together, each in its own way, under the action of the Holy Spirit, they contribute effectively to the salvation of the world".

Question: What do the three pillars of the Divine Revelation teach you?
