Artist Paul Sayers; short biography

Paul Sayers lives and works in St Leonards/Hastings on the South Coast and is primarily a painter.

He studied at Central Saint Martins in London.

Having been in creative practice for over 30years, Paul has both painting and 3D Design work in his portfolio and until very recently he was a Senior Lecturer also at Central Saint Martins.

His work responds to issues and ideas that emerge from the often hidden semantic and semiotic language of the everyday, it attempts to illuminate the detail ways we live our lives.

Paul has twice exhibited at the RA Summer Exhibition and had solo shows at both The Barbican Centre and the Royal Air Force Museum Gallery in London (where his work is held in their collection) and Insead Gallery in France, as well as numerous group exhibitions.

Paul is a member of the SouthCoast Artists Group (SoCo) and Hastings Arts Forum (HAF Gallery) where he is also a trustee.

Current and future projects include exhibitions with the working titles;

*Cloud Chambers series, A series of at least 10 large abstract canvases about the infinitely small, so small that it can not actually be seen, only the affects left behind in the wake of movements and trajectories are visible, a way of analysising and understanding what has happened and possibly why.

*Imperfections series, This series idea has come from a drawing that was part of the most recent SoCo (SouthCoast Artists Group) exhibition, exploring imperfections as a metaphor of our interactions with others, as we each naavigate our way through life... trying to keep on the 'straight and narrow' without causing friction with those around us.

*Pollutants, these will be about how something quite small can have a dramatic effect on a larger entity; this is partly a comment on radicalism and extremism.
