Does a friend or family member who has been arrested and you want to find them? To see who is in the chautauqua county jail you need to click on their website and do search an inmate. Inmate Lookup The Chautauqua County Jail Inmate Locator has information about people who were arrested and are now in jail, including status, how much their bail is, and schedule for visitation. Also you provide the same information for anyone arrested and processed or released in the past 24 hours. Prisoners are shown in alphabetical order with their last names. A mugshot is actually two photos one and a profile picture. Your full name and intake number will appear on the photos, and they will be in the file. When you search for mugshots online you need to enter their full name, and an arrest date, if you have one. After you have gone through booking, the bail is determined by bail schedule or magistrate. If there is no bail set this can mean that you are either released, pending trial, or you will be held in jail until your court date. If you bail out you will have to agree to be there before your court date, and you are not allowed to leave the area. Usually, prisoners will be given early release in exchange for good behavior if they don't break the rules and area a good prisoner while incarcerated. If you prove to be trustworthy, you participate in a work release program. You will be required to return to prison every day when you finish work, or you may be allowed to live in a shelter instead of prison. Your bail is money you must pay to the court to be released from prison until you go to court. The amount you have to pay depends on how serious your costs are. Someone will need 10 percent of the total set post to be released. If you don't show up for your gig, the person who bailed you out will lose that deposit. If the conditions of bail are not violated, you will receive this money back. Bail Bondsman If the amount of bail set is large, or you just can't afford it, you should hire a bail bondsman. Bondsmen typically have a fee of 10 to 15 percent of the total bail amount, and in most cases have a minimum fee of \$100. The money you pay to the deposit is not refunded and must be paid in cash. If the bail is very large, the bondman can demand that they use assets as collateral. Once the prison is occupied, it will take a while to be processed. The first step is to answer a number of questions, such as your full name, address, date of birth and an emergency contact. You will also be asked about your psychological and medical history. You get a prisoner ID. You're going to get fingerprints. You get your mugshot taken. Every property you have will be taken away from you and will be saved until you are released. You will be given to make a phone call to contact family, friends, or bail bondsman. If they expect you to make bail and be released soon, you could continue wearing your own clothes, if not you get a prison jumpsuit. Have you been arrested and taken by the prison? Click here to share your discharge proceedings story Once bail is booked, you will be allowed to go home after you are discharged. Getting fired lasts all day until all day. In other words, the sooner you post bail, the sooner you get released from prison. It may also depend on whether you have a cash bond amount or if the magistrate must decide on the amount of bail to be determined. For small expenses, you will simply be booked and get released without bail post. Once you have completed your prison sentence and know the date of your release, you expect to be released between 9:00 and 12:00. How To Turn Yourself In Warrant Out for Your Arrest, or if you start your jail sentence, it is highly recommended that you do the right thing and voluntarily turn yourself in. For a warrant, report to the prison processing area, and tell an officer who thinks there's an arrest warrant. They will check their system to see if there are any outstanding local, state or federal arrest warrants for you, and if they check if you have one, you will be taken into custody. If it's for a prison sentence, go to jail at the time and date when the sentence order requires you. Make sure you're not late. Make sure you only bring the required items when you go, such as a driver's license or your ID, a prescription which you could take, as well as the sentencing order. Visitation procedures Detainees should be given the and date of birth of each visitor to the prison prior to the visit. The information of your visitor goes as an approved visitor in the visitation log. Every visitor must legitimize themselves. Anyone who comes late to visit or does not have a visitation order, cannot go to visitation. The prison visit policy changes regularly, so check the official site before visiting an inmate. Visiting Hours Phone Calls & Phone Usage Policy All phone calls from prison are made via a prison approved pre-paid phone account or phone card. Calls in prison are much more expensive than phone calls outside prison. Prisoners are able to make calls, with restrictions on when and how often you use the phone, but prisoners should keep in mind that a long line can form on the phones because everyone wants to use the phone, too. If you break the rules, an inmate's ability to use the phone can be scaled back or eliminated entirely as part of the punishment. The Chautauqua County Jail phone number is: 716-753-2131 Transmission of email to inmates Every post you send to an inmate is required to be emailed using the actual U.S. Postal Service, and not courier or delivery, or hand-delivered. You do not use any other form of mail or parcel delivery. You have to write the person's name, the inmate's ID number and the prison address on the envelope. Mail no box, padded envelope, plastic or paper bag, or an envelope with metal parts. All email is accessed and examined and read by prison officers, and will be returned if the prison decides it is inappropriate. Return To Main Menu Court Information Get A Lawyer If you are arrested, you should be aware that you still have rights, one of these is your right to ask a lawyer. You don't have to make many calls when you're arrested, so you'd be wise to ask a friend or family member to find a lawyer when you call them. You may be wondering 'I don't need to get a lawyer – I can just represent myself' You represent yourself if you really want to, but a lawyer can advise you on your rights, help you protect your interests and help you because of the legal system you're dealing with right now. The sooner you get a lawyer on your charges, the better off you're. The Public Defender also has access to private investigators, forensic experts and social workers. How did they do it? Court Records Chautauqua County court records are public records. They have filed a file with a sheet called a docket sheet and all motions, documents and evidence filed during your trial. You, and someone else, can access your court records through the Chautauqua County website, or by going to the Chautauqua County Clerk of Court where the case was filed. Clerk De Chautauqua County Clerk of Court is an officer of the court who administers court documents. They also administer the oath when the court is in session, and read the court verdict when the jury has ended deliberations. All files related to your case are available from the court clerk. Fees For Court fees are the costs and costs of your lawsuit, such as filing fees, litigation costs and various legal costs. If you can't afford to pay these fees and have a court-appointed lawyer, you may not need to pay them. Magistrate A Magistrate is the judge who will preside over your case. Magistrate judges do many different things, including setting bail, issuing arrest warrants, and acting as the presiding judge on initial court appearances and detention hearings. Pre-sentencing Your pre-sentencing report has been compiled to include the defendant's background information and details of the arrestee's life, which the magistrate will consider when determining your sentence. Information, details and character witnesses will be gathered from the suspect, his or her family, and if necessary the victim. Remember that you ask to see your own copy of the report before you are convicted so that you can correct any incorrect information. Conviction After you're convicted of a felony, you'll be convicted. The judge will have several options in sentencing you, ranging from community service and probation, to even prison or imprisonment. Depending on the seriousness of the crime, you will either be locked up immediately, or you will be given a date to surrender and report to prison to serve your term. Return To Main Menu Public Records Inmate Inquiry Do you want to know if someone is incarcerated, or ever in jail? To do this, you need to query the prison website and do prisoner search, and search using: The name of the prisoner. Date of birth. Their booking date. and their prisoner ID. If you think they are currently in jail, you call the prison get confirmation. Warrant to investigate If you think you have a one order, you can access court documents on the Chautauqua County court website or call the jail directly. You have to have that person's first and last name. Or you just go to jail and ask questions at the information desk. Please note that if you have an outstanding warrant, you will be taken into custody immediately. Arrest investigation If you know the person's first and last name, as well as their arrest date, contact the Chautauqua County jail, either by phone, go there in person, or check online. The data of arrests are in the public record and these reports are available to everyone. Civil investigation Civil lawsuits are when you are served with legal papers, which may be justified. You can access civil lawsuit orders by contacting the Chautauqua County Sheriff's Office, online or by phone. Sex offender Search/Lookup All convicted sex offenders must be listed and registered on a sex offender database. Those in these databases are convicted in a court of a sex or kidnapping crime. You can access these listings on the website, but keep in mind that you will not get the exact address, but only the block on which they live. Court Records Court Records are public records and available to everyone. These records include a court file that contains a docket and one of the filings and documents in the case. You are able to access judicial files over the Internet, or with the Registrar of the Court in the jurisdiction where the case was filed. Criminal records Each state keeps a record of its citizen's criminal background. These online databases are all linked so you follow criminal convictions from another state. You are able to go to the Chautauqua County Courthouse and check in person or check the website. It helps to get to know the county, and in case the crime was in a very different state, you have to pay for a more complete search. A criminal records department will seek you a list of any arrests, charges, or convictions for

these crimes: DWI or DUI. Drug offenses such as possession or trafficking. Kidnapping. Sexual assaults, including rape, sexual assault. Violent crimes. Theft, burglary. If you do a check of the criminal record, in most cases you will not find out if that person has had moving violations, such as: Speeding. Lost or suspended their driver's license or driver's license. Accidents. Minor violations or moving violations. Parking tickets. FBI Top Ten Most Wanted List Return To Main Menu Life In Jail/What Its Like Daily Life Just the thought of spending time in Chautauqua County Jail is quite unpleasant, you will soon settle into the routine that is set for you in jail. All prisoners get an alarm to wake up at about six in the morning, and then you have roll call. Then you have breakfast. When you have finished eating breakfast, participate in the work program or other activity you are assigned. This can work in the kitchen, laundry, or some kind of production job. While this may seem annoying, it can help you when you leave prison, as you gain experience in a particular field of work. Other prisoners attend school, while some participate in mandatory treatment programs. After lunch, there will be another roll call, then back to work. Your evening will be spent in your cell or a common area. During this time dinner is served and you are expected to take a shower. After another phone call, the lights are out. Even if you are confined to your cell, there may be enough light to read or write letters. Then again, most prisoners welcome lights off, and try to get as much sleep as they can. Most people are afraid of the idea of prison because they don't know what to expect. If you spent some time in Chautauqua County Jail, your experiences would be welcomed, as it can help another person to deal with it. Dress Code When locked up, all inmates are expected to wear the Chautauqua County Jail uniform. This is normally a jumpsuit or scrubs. Of interest to anyone visiting a prisoner - you must be well dressed. Clothing that is considered inappropriate is not allowed. How to send money to an inmate You have your own bank account while you're in prison. This money is used to buy items from the Commissary. Family and friends can deposit money into this account for you, and all the money you earn while in prison will also be deposited into your account. Outside money can be paid into your account via a money order, cash or check. If someone sends a check or money order, make sure they write your prisoner ID on it. The maximum amount you can get in your account is \$290 per month. The procedure for sending money to people in prison may change, so we recommend checking the official website when you send money to an inmate. Commissary The Commissioner is the prison shop. You buy some things here, such as toiletries, snacks writing supplies. Keep in mind that you probably want to use the Commissioner daily, and any violations will get that privilege taken away from you. Prisoner Medications If you are on any type of prescription medication, you will be allowed to continue taking it while Prison. When you are first processed, you will be asked what medication you are taking. You will then be referred to the prison nurse or doctor who will be tasked with monitoring your health and prescribing your medication. Meals You get three meals a day: breakfast, lunch and dinner. As expected, they are very basic, but healthy. A typical breakfast can be cereal, toast, coffee and fruit. Lunch can be spaghetti, salad, bread and milk. Dinner can be chicken casserole, rice, vegetables, dessert and milk. Contrary to popular belief, prison food has improved greatly over the years, and you might find that it is not much different from what you would eat at home. Pods/The Yard The prison is designed in a 'pod' layout, with self-contained enclosure arranged around an outdoor garden. Each pod has a central control station and a common area, and the prisoners take turns in using the yard. The prison is designed in this way to keep certain prisoners together, and others away from the general population. Gangs As with life in general, gangs are part of prison life. Obviously it is best to avoid being a part of this environment as it will only cause problems. When you first go to prison, you find yourself prepared to join a gang, or worse, you might get their attention in a negative way. The best thing is to keep your head down and not get involved. Back to main menu news and Media News Photos/Photos Videos return to main menu jobs types of jobs in Chautauqua County Jail The deputy sheriff is the second in command at the Chautauqua County Jail, overseeing day-to-day operations and managing the jail. An inmate probably won't have much interaction with the deputy sheriff unless they've committed an offense. Detention Officers are responsible for the custody and care of the prisoners. They maintain order in prison, and they handle security. A Detention Officer is assigned to a particular pod, and is therefore responsible for the same prisoners every day. They get to know the prisoners at a certain level and are well equipped to deal with any problems that may arise. Apply for a job at Chautauqua County Jail Requirements: You must be over the age of 21. You must have a High School Diploma or GED You must be a U.S. citizen. You must pass a Criminal, Credit and Driving History background check. You have to pass a drug test. You have to have a good level of fitness. You must be in good health. You must have a valid driver's license. must be in possession of a law enforcement certification. Victim rights The Victim Rights Act grants victims the following rights: Victims are entitled to protection from the accused. Victims are entitled to report. Victims have the right to attend the proceedings. Victims have the right to speak during criminal proceedings. Victims have the right to consult with the prosecution. Victims are entitled to restitution. Victims have a right to a speedy trial. Victims have a right to be treated fairly, with dignity and respect. The definition of victim includes: Spouses and children of all victims. Parents and guardians of underage victims. Parents, guardians and siblings of mentally or physically incapacitated victims or victims of murder. Foster parents or other carers, under certain circumstances. There are a number of services and programs designed to help victims and their families. You will learn more about these services by contacting the courthouse, or the local law enforcement agency. Victim reporting The Department of Justice Victim Notification System (VNS) is a system that provides victims with information about their case and/or any suspects in the case. You will receive a Victim Identification Number (VIN) and a personal identification number (PIN) that allows you to access VNS via the Internet or telephone. Here you will find information about future court hearings, historical court events and detailed information about the accused. This includes criminal charges filed, the outcome of the charges, imposed penalty, custody location, expected release date and all other release information. The VNS website is updated daily.
