

The girl pumps up some groundwater for the boys to drink.


resource: something very useful or valuable that belongs to a country, community, or person.

Pollution - Reading Water Pollution

One of the most important **resources** on earth is water. Without water, nothing can live. Water pollution occurs when harmful and toxic waste enters our water in rivers, lakes, ponds, oceans, etc. This harms the plants and animals that live in the water. Also, it sometimes reaches our groundwater which might contaminate the water we use in our homes, including our drinking water. This can make us very sick and cause serious diseases.

Sometimes water pollution can happen from natural activities such as volcanoes, animal waste, and residue from storms and floods. Humans also pollute the water by dumping sewage and garbage into the water. Oil spills, farming chemicals, and toxic factory waste also pollute our water. There are always outbreaks of sickness in many poorer countries caused by contaminated drinking water. Water pollution also kills many plants and animals.



Pollution - Reading Water Pollution

Only 1% of the earth's water is freshwater. The rest is salty, and we can't drink it. So, we must protect our water sources. We can start by saving water. We can take shorter showers and turn off taps when not in use, like when washing dishes or brushing your teeth. We can also tell family and friends the importance of clean water. We should never throw our trash into the water. Always throw trash away properly.
