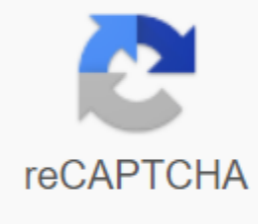

He cashed in over \$4,000,000 during the four years he played live poker. Jonathan currently lives in Las Vegas, Nevada, when he does not travel around the world playing tournaments with the highest stakes. He owns www.FloatTheTurn.com, a poker training site where he teaches how to become an online poker player winner. He also offers one-on-one coaching through www.JonathanLittleSecrets.com. He even taught on November 9, Steve Begleiter in preparation for his WSOP main event final table. He is also a member of the Victory Poker Team, which is where he can be found playing online. Jonathan Little is a professional poker player from Pensacola, Florida, who started playing poker when he was 18 years old. As someone who is constantly striving to improve his game, I'm looking forward to seeing whether or not these books provide new learning opportunities and weapons I can add to my poker arsenal. However, I read every book, especially those focused on strategy, and take the advice with a grain of salt. After all, it seems that everything you can write about poker has already been written a dozen times. So I was extremely skeptical when I got my copy of Jonathan Little Secrets of Professional Poker Tournament (SOPTP) Volume 1. Given that this is the first volume you've probably already bred there are a number of books. This is true in that there is a planned series, but it is the only volume that has been released. Volume II will be released in November. At SOPTP, Little focuses on the basics and way of handling different stack sizes, revealing many of the strategies and tactics he used to find success in the tournament. With over \$4.6 million in lifetime profit, as well as World Poker Tour Season VI Player of the Year, Little has the experience to dispense poker tips. For these reasons, and the fact that he personally wrote every word in the book, I had to give SOPTP a fair shake. This book is meant to be the final book on tournament poker, Little says in the introduction. Unfortunately, it is too premature to determine whether or not that claim has water (this is only volume 1, after all), but I'd say, I'd say, Few things go to a good start. First, SOPTP is very well written. Few, obviously, have the natural ability to convey complex concepts and thoughts on paper in a simple manner. Reading a book has become a personalized and focused affair, almost like having a little mentoring you right at the table. The author's ability to communicate with the reader is refreshing. Instead of telling you what to do, he just explains what he's doing and why. Offering his opinion and challenging the misconceptions of readers, Little brings up using the Socrates method, which proves to be very effective in this case. Most of the material in the book can be found in any poker strategy book (post-flop concept, flop game, etc.); however, it is the attention to detail that makes SOPTP appropriate. Few things break each of these umbrella concepts into more specific concepts. For example, when discussing a game in the river, which many books present as simple and understandable, Little breaks it into ten plays, from a call when you think you're being beaten to not putting an opponent in a place. Coming from those who cover dozens of poker tournaments, I can tell you that what separates the best pros from the masses is attention to detail and understanding of the decision-making process. A little one of these pros, and as the name suggests, he willingly shares his secret to get you to this level. Here's a quick look at some of the sections in SOPTP: ImageMake Friends at TableValue BettingFloat Do not be afraid of Going BrokeGamble to get the best stack These sections have been particularly effective in grabbing my attention. Some of them, such as Image and Making Friends at the Table, are concepts that I have heard before, but are usually overlooked. In addition, there were some sections of gems in different chapters, including knowing what you are causing, advertising plays, fantasy play syndrome, and giving the illusion of times justice. Many of these topics, as well as others scattered throughout the book, are such things usually found in online forums and message boards, which is not a mistake. True, Little patrolled the forums and used them to cultivate his game. In fact, he credits the forums for much of his success. Working in the poker industry, too, occasionally pierce forums, and while there is a ton of frivolous information floating about, there is some very useful information. I believe that past discussions in these forums have radically changed the game by carefully teaching those who play it. With forums, the problem is wading through the crap to get good stuff. Fortunately for readers, Little has collected many of the forum's gems in handy text. Believe me when I say that reading a book will save you hours of surfing useless topics. Finally, Little's decision Include hands and stories from his various tournament experiences, most notably his big WPT wins proved interesting and helped break the monotony that often accompanies the strategy books. Not only that, Little uses them properly, always using them to help ensure the execution of the point. If you want to improve your game and pick up a book that can help you do that, then give SOPTP a try. This is not a book that is going to revolutionize poker, but Little has remained informed of his word and gathered all the relevant information you need to succeed in tournament poker.
