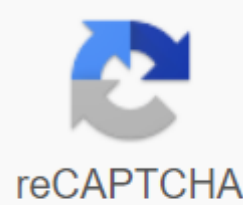

If you learn to be a guitarist (like me) and you work through a book like a guitar fretboard workout (like me!), you'll need lots of sheets of empty tablature to do your exercises on. Initially, I would just make 6 horizontal lines through a blank sheet of paper, each horizontal line representing a guitar string, and then maybe 15 vertical lines for frets. Doing it once or twice is not too bothersome, but after drawing a tenth free fretboard I started to get annoyed with the process. Each exercise on the guitar requires a new clean sheet of tablature (or a simulated fret board), so it quickly becomes a lot of work - even before you start the exercise. So I decided to create a Word document template for guitar tablature. This is just one page of the document, and each page contains 6 fretboard charts. Wu Hu! If you have a page with all the strings and frets of them you can just print out as many copies as you want, do exercises on them and then print out a few more. Get it here: guitar tabs in Word. It took me ages getting everything that fitted with the right sizes. I'll give you a little secret. I used tables for every ladboard. The fact is that you need a rectangle formed by two adjacent strings and two adjacent frets to be wide and not very high if it should visually represent the rook of a guitar. It took some setting of height and width of the dining cell, I can tell you! But that is not all. To truly imitate the guitar fret board, you need fret markers on the third, fifth, seventh, ninth, twelfth, fifteenth and seventeen frets. They were drawn using forms in Word (insert and shape and oval). Anyway, feel free to download my Word guitar tabs and use them in your own exercises, but don't reprint them on another site. Hello: I just developed a guitar tablature sheet in Excel for those who might want to design a song. I've allowed a few different time signatures as well. It only took me a few minutes to do, so I thought I would share so that if I lose it again, it will always be available. Here it is. This version of the guitar tabs will be good for songs that have 4 beats on the bar, or, in other words, tunes that are divided into 4. 18 Notes on the Bar This version has the longest bars, and is good for songs that have tunes that can be divided into 3. Symbols and Terminology Tab There is also a tab on a template called Symbols and Terminology that will show you all the different characters of guitar tabs that you can use and what each character means. On this tab you'll also find cells/strings that contain empty guitar tabs, so you can quickly reset or fix your tabs by simply copying and pasting. If you want to reset one cell, or the entire sheet, you can do so quickly without having to individually delete and replace each note. This tab also shows actual examples of how to use hammers and pull-ups. If you want, you can use separate cells for place h or p for hammering and pull-up, but this will affect how many notes can be stored in each bar. So if you want to use the characters without taking away the extra space/cells, then you can just enter the character before or after the appropriate note, in the same camera. This way, you'll be able to use special characters in guitar tabs without disturbing the orderly placement of notes. To store additional guitar tabs in the table template, you can create a new copy of the entire file, or you can simply copy tabs to store multiple songs in one file. If you want, you can also print out these guitar tabs, before or after creating your song. There are also designated spaces at the top of guitar tabs that will allow you to write/enter songs, and other important information about the song. Get Google Sheets Guitar Tabs Pattern How How To Google Sheets Guitar Tab Template To use this guitar tab template, follow these steps: first click on the link to the template, and then click the Button button in the top right corner of the screen. This will make your own copy, which can be edited. (Some cells that don't need to be edited will display a warning if you try to edit them) then select the version which is best for you between 12 cells, 16 cells and 14 cells on the bar by clicking the appropriate table tab then click on the cell where you want to start your song, and enter a number or symbol that represents a note you need to play you can click after entering the number, or instead of clicking the enter you can click one of the directional keys that will not only enter the number into the cell... but it will also make the cursor go in the direction that you want it after the number is taken into the cell (clicking will put the cursor in the cell below each time). You can quickly move on to new notes or new lines with direction keys, or you can click in the cell you want to edit each time. Do what works best for you! To re-make the tabs empty, you can simply copy and paste cells, strings, or even a few lines from a place that hasn't been edited into a place you want to reset to clean. You can use the tabs on the song sheet to do this, or you can also use the empty tabs found on the Sheet Symbols and terminology to copy and paste fresh/empty guitar tabs. If there is a section of the song that you want to repeat, just copy the cells that contain the part you want to copy and then insert the copied selection into a new location. To print guitar tabs, just click the File button, then Print, being in the guitar tab template, and make sure you choose Fit to page. You can also print guitar tabs on the PDF by choosing Print to PDF instead of selecting a printer. But remember that there are empty GEITAR PDF tabs at the top of this page that you can download and/or print directly. How to read guitar tabs In case you don't already know how to read guitar tabs, here's how: Guitar tabs display 6 lines, each of which is a string on a 6-string guitar. The bottom line is the largest string with the bottom notes on the guitar (E string). The top line is the smallest string that has the highest notes on the guitar (e string). In guitar tabs, the numbers are written on the lines to represent which notes/fret is playing on that line. If 0 is placed on the guitar tab line, it means that the string plays without the fret pressed (This is called an open note) If 1 on the guitar tab line, this means that the first fret of the corresponding string is pressed and then the string is ripped off. Guitar tabs are read and played from left to right, just like Books. Because you play every note on the sheet from left to right, you play a song that is written on a sheet. Below are additional characters that can be used to signify special ways to play notes on the guitar, such as sliding, hammering and taking off.
