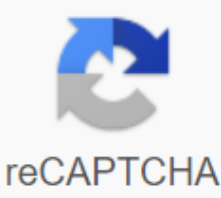

You can get these topics into the speaking test and essay topics related to them. It also helps with your reading section because more complex words that you know better understand the context. Example - Only four girls have been elected president of the student body since the introduction of the joint in 1973. CHEAT Value - deprive something of value through deception or fraud. Example - Some levels of the game were so tough that I had to resort to cheats to get through. LITERACY Value - The quality or condition of being literate. An example is Their goal is to achieve basic literacy. 3. IDIOMS What is an idiom? A group of words set by the use as having meanings not pumped out of individual words. For example - Over the moon, get cold feet. To give a group of 7 or more in IELTS, experts will see if you use a less common and more idiotic vocabulary. However, it is difficult to learn idioms and use them at the right time and in context. You have to be careful trying to put them in the IELTS test and it will probably be a noticeable examiner. You have to come to a level where you can use the idioms fairly. You should not only study them theoretically, but also know their practical use. If you have an IELTS group of 5 to 5.5 in your practical tests, you can forget about the idioms and focus more on improving your overall vocabulary first. COLLOCATION Collocation refers to words (often two or three) that are usually placed together. This is one of the most important concepts to understand when preparing for the IELTS test. To achieve a group score of 7, you not only need to know these words, but also know how to connect them with other words. Whenever you learn these words, you will learn in such a way that you know how to use them in the right context. This is much more effective than learning words in isolation.
