ATV SAFETY INSPECTION CHECKLIST

Read and understand the manufacturer's manual and guide for safe operation.
Ensure your regular maintenance is up-to-date.
Check that your fuel tank is full.
Verify the oil is clean and topped up.
Inspect tires for proper air pressure and excessive wear.
If a track is present, ensure it's aligned and in good shape.
Confirm your safety gear is in good shape.
Stock up your emergency kit. Consider a fire extinguisher or shovel.
Have a tire repair kit packed and ready to go if needed.
Inspect footrests, cables, and lines for good repair.
Ensure there are no loose objects or items that might get tangled in the wheels or axles.
Confirm all of your lights are working.
Ensure the handlebars turn the full range without resistance.
Verify the throttle runs smoothly regardless of handlebar position.
Test brakes for proper function at various speeds.
Check to ensure that the engine stops when the tether is removed if tether is present.
Listen for any engine knock on startup, running and shutdown.
Check all visible lines for fluid leaks.
