The game does not require reading and minimal counting skills, making it suitable for young children. Because of the design of the game, there is no strategy involved: players are never required to make a choice, just follow the instructions. The winner is predetermined by a shuffling of cards. A perennial favorite, the game sells about a million copies a year. Gameplay Race is woven around a storyline about finding King Kandy, the lost king of Candy Land. The board consists of a winding, linear walkway of 134 spaces, most red, green, blue, yellow, orange or purple. Other pink spaces are named in places such as Candy Cane Forest and Gumdrop Mountain, or characters such as queen Frostin and Gramm Nutt. Players take turns removing the top card from the stack, most of which show one of the six colors, and then move the marker forward to the next space of that color. Some cards have two color marks, in which case the player moves the marker forward to the second-next space of that color. The deck has one card for each location, and the drawing of such a card moves the player directly to that seat of the board. This move can be both forward and backward in the classic game; Reverse moves can be ignored for young players in the 2004 version of the game. Prior to the 2006 edition, the board had three colored spaces marked by a dot. Two of these spaces were designated as cherry traps, while the other was located in the Molasses Swamp. The player who lands on this space gets stuck (all cards are ignored until the card is drawn in the same color as the square). In the 2006 version, point spaces were replaced by licorice spaces that prompted the player to land on it to simply lose the next turn. The game is won by landing on or passing the final area and thus reaching the goal of the candy castle. Official rules indicate that any card that will cause the player to advance past the last square wins the game, but many play so that you need to land on the last square to win. The 2004 version changed the last space from a purple square to a rainbow space, which means that it applies to any color drawn by the player, thus resolving any debate about who wins the game. In 2013, Candy Land sold Hasbro with a spinner instead of cards. The spinner includes all the results that were on the cards. The Story Game was developed in 1948 by Eleanor Abbott, while she is recovering from polo in San Diego, California. The game was made for and tested in the same wards of the hospital. The children invited Abbott to present the game to Milton Bradley's company. The game was bought by Milton Bradley and first published in 1949 as a temporary fill for their then main line of products, school supplies. Candy Land became Milton Bradley's best-selling game, surpassing its previous top seller, Uncle Wiggins, and put the company in the same league as its main competitor, Parker Brothers. The original art was supposedly Abbott, though it is unknown. In 1984, Hasbro acquired Milton Bradley. Landmark Entertainment Group updated the game with new art, adding characters and storylines in 1984. Hasbro releases several versions of the game and sees it as a brand. For example, they market Candy Land puzzles, a travel version, a citation necessary personal computer game, and portable electronic versions. Candy Land was involved in one of the first disputes over domain names on the Internet in 1996. The adult web content provider candyland.com, and Hasbro objected. Hasbro received an injunction against the use. In 2012, Hasbro announced a film that sparked a landmark Entertainment Group lawsuit over ownership and royalties belonging to characters and a storyline featured in the 1984 edition. The Admissions Industry Association game called Candy Land the most popular game in the U.S. for the 1940s. Versions of at least four versions of the infusion game Candy Land have been made. First dates since 1949. This version and other early versions had only locations (Molasses Swamp, Gumdrop Mountains, etc.) and no characters. The board, copyrighted in 1962, shows a mock-up of the track, different from later versions. In the first edition the pawns were wooden, but were changed in the 1967 version to plastic gingerbread. The 1984 edition featured characters such as Mr. Mint and Gramma Nutt, the storyline, has a modern track layout and ends with a purple square. Some characters and names were changed in 2002. The queen Frostin became Princess Frostin, the classic Molasses Swamp was changed to Chocolate Swamp, Princess Lolly was changed to Lolly, and The Plumi character was completely removed. The vCR version of the infusion game was made in 1986. Hasbro released an electronic version of the game for Windows in 1998. An animated 2005 feature, Candy Land: The Great Lollipop Adventure, was released and later spawned a DVD version of Candy Land. Give Kids Peace: The Village Edition of Candy Land was produced by Hasbro specifically for Give Kids The World Village, a nonprofit resort in Kissimmee, Florida for children with life-threatening illnesses and their families. In this version, the traditional characters of Candy Land and were replaced by places and symbols of the village, such as Mayor Clayton and Ms. Merry. There are licensed versions of Candy Land with characters such as Winnie the Pooh, Dora the Explorer and SpongeBob. Kids - In the classic version, they are two blonde twins. In 2002, there are four children of different races. In the 2013 edition they are marshmallows, an ice cream cone, gumdrop, and gingerbread girl. Mr. Mint - He lives in Candycane Forest, and candy cane lumberjack. He was removed from World of Sweets and then returned for the 2013 version as a skater instead of a lumberjack. You can also call Turbs. Duke Swirl - Replacing Mr. Mint in the 2010 edition. Gramma Nutt - Gramma Nutt lives in a fragile peanut house on the corner of Candyland. Renamed Nana in the 2014 edition. Buzz King Kandy as King candy land. He lives in a castle of sweets. Hilarious - a happy chubby monster representing gumdrops. It was removed in the 2010 version and then after widespread outrage and demand was returned for publication 2013; however, it was again removed in the 2014 edition. Plumpy is a fuzzy green monster under a gingerbread plum tree. It was removed in the 2002 version and replaced by Mamma Ginger Tree. Mamma Ginger Tree - Makes the best gingers in all Candy Land. It was removed from the game. Cupcake Commons is the replacement of Mamma Ginger Tree in the 2010 version. Princess Lolly was renamed Lolly after the 2002 edition and later renamed Princess Lolly in 2010 and 2014. queen Frostin - She was renamed Princess Frostin in the 2002 edition. Lord Likoris is a Candyland villain. He runs Likoris Castle in classic games, Les Likoris in 2002 and Laguna in 2014. Spidora Buzzy Crockett Gloppy - Friendly Monster of Chocolate (originally from Molasses) Gingerbread Kids Jib Ginga Ninja Grandma Goopy Fluffypuffer Places Candy Castle (known as King Candy Castle in 2014 edition) - a destination players are trying to achieve. Cupcake Commons (Locations) Gingerbread Trees - Where Plumpy sits eating plums from his gingerbread. Gumdrop Mountain - Offers gumdrop way, or label. Likoris Castle is a black and red licorice lock with licorice bats. Lollipop Woods is a forest of rainbow lollipops resembling trees. Molasse/Chocolate Marsh - molasses/chocolate swamp with popsicle brown plants. Peanuts Fragile House - Peanut cottage brittle with peanut plants growing outside. Mint forest - a snow thicket of mint candy. Ice cream sea - sparkling sea of ice cream, where the queen Frostin lives. Ice Cream Slopes - Ice Cream Mountains where the Duke of Swirl resides. The Ice Palace of Likoris Forest is a forest of red and black licorice, where Lord Likoris lives. Licorice Laguna Chocolate Mountain Cupcake Commons Peanuts Acres Snowflake Lake Nana's Nut House house where Gramma Nutt resides lollipop Palace - the palace where Princess Lolly resides. (December 2014) (Learn how and when to remove this message template) The Candy section of Toys R Us in New York Times Square maintained a Candy Land theme before losing its license for the characters in 2006. The theme included a colored path that mimicked the game board, several Candy Land characters, and candy-themed racks and ceiling decorations. Some people believe that Candy Land inspired Dylan Lauren (daughter of Ralph Lauren) to create the Dylan Candy Bar store, also located in New York City, but it was actually the popular Willy Wonka movie and the chocolate factory that inspired her to start a candy store, although characters from the Candy Land game can be seen throughout the store. At the Disney Marketplace center in Florida, there is a link to the Candy Land rules on the ceiling of the toy store. The rules have been slightly changed with some humor and sarcasm added, such as the rule of #6 which states: Play as above until someone reaches the multicolored space near the castle or someone loses their cool and flips the gameboard . The music video for Katy Perry's song California Gurls includes a tincture world called Candyfornia under the strong influence of Candy Land. Hasbro in 2011 released a special comic book called Unit:E, which had many characters from Hasbro-owned properties, like M.A.S.K., Jem, G.I. Joe and Micronauts; here Princess Lolly was briefly depicted and mentioned as a potential ally of Micronaut Acroyear in his fight against Baron Karza. In the book Fast Tips for Busy Families by Jay Payleitner, the head of Candy Land Repentance describes the use of the game as punishment, forcing older children to play with their younger siblings. However, the author's eldest child, Alec, laid down the deck to shorten the game. When confronted, Alec then tormented his younger sister by making her deck, teasing her with victory only to pull her game piece repeatedly back into the swamp. An animated 2005 adaptation of Candy Land: The Great Lollipop Adventure was released. In February 2009, Universal Pictures announced plans to make a film based on the infusion game Candy Land. Ethan Cohen, writer of the comedies Madagascar: Escape 2 Africa and Tropical Thunder was hired to write the script. Kevin Lima, who directed charmed the Enchanted, was set to direct. However, in 2011, a new script team consisting of Jonathan Aibel and Glenn Berger was appointed. They said: We don't view it as a film based on tincture, although it has characters from this world and accepts the idea of people caught up in a world that happens to be completely out of candy where there are huge battles going on. We go for real comedy, real action, and real emotions at stake. By January 2012, Columbia Pictures, Happy Madison and Adam Sandler were in final talks to develop the film, with Sandler starring and co-writing the screenplay with Robert Smigel.
