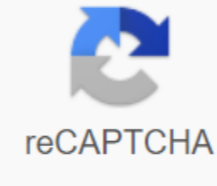

If you're editing home movies to show the family over the holidays or you're getting ready to read more!Movie (Mac OS) Apple's consumer end video editing package is so ubiquitous that you can tell if the video has been edited with iMovie just by looking at the opening and closing screens and the type of cuts and napkins used during the video. However, an experienced video editor can make great looking videos with it, it's incredibly easy to use, and the drag and drop interface makes it easy to apply effects, titles, soundtracks and other settings to your video, and then sit back, view it, and export it to burn on DVD, upload to YouTube, or save in HD to view on the big screen. iMovie is part of iLife, and ships on every Mac. If you don't have one, you can buy it from the iLife Suite for \$49. The Sony Vegas Pro (Windows) Sony Vegas Pro is pricey starting at \$599.95, but this price gets you serious power and professional-level features for a video editor who is looking to take their videos from Windows Movie Maker to the next level. Vegas Pro offers Blu-ray drive authorship, editing tools for standard def, high definition, or even 3D video, support for multi-camera video editing, and support for more audio and video formats than you might need. In addition to its video editing tools, Sony Vegas Pro also offers professional sound editing tools to match, and a drag and drop interface that makes starting with the tool deceptively easy, given the power that is under the hood. Final Cut Pro (Mac OS) Whether you prefer the newest version of Final Cut Pro X or the previous classic version before Apple's numerous product changes, Final Cut Pro has been a staple in video editing for years. For many, this tool is the perfect bridge between consumer-level video editing products and professional level thanks to easy-to-understand interface and powerful editing tools. Final Cut Pro has a broad support file format for audio and video, multi-volume editing that lets you see all your audio and video tracks in the same form, a media organization window that shows you all available videos and audio clips in one view, a preview mode that lets you try your edits on size before committing them, a comprehensive clip manager, and more, in all resolutions From standard def to HD to 4K. Although, Final Cut Pro will set you back \$299.99.AVID (Windows/Mac OS) AVID Media Composer is a professional-level video editing tool, and has been used to produce more than a few big box office movies as well as music videos, TV shows, commercials, and everything in between. AVID Studio, on the other hand, is home and version of the award-winning professional product. AVID Studio will set you back \$169.99, where AVID Media Composer is much more expensive for \$2,499.00. Both products have more than enough energy to get the job done, but the one you want will depend on what you're editing the video. AVID Studio is best suited for users wanting to make home videos, produce home movies or independent movies (while getting some exposure to the professional toolkit at AVID Media Composer), and need comprehensive media management and editing tools to help make their independent films look as professional as possible. AVID Media Composer, on the other hand, the video and audio editing powerhouse is used for professional video production, with a feature to match-one that includes all the functions of other suites in the roundup. Adobe Premiere Pro (Windows/Mac OS) Adobe Premiere Pro is part of Adobe Creative Suite design and media applications, but can be purchased alone, like Adobe Premiere Elements for \$99, and Adobe Premiere Pro for \$799.99. Despite its price tag, Premiere Pro is the standard of video editing for many, and offers integration with other Adobe products, more video effects than you might wish, native file editing format (and, it's worth noting, supports a wealth of video, images and audio formats without forcing you to convert in the first place), 3D video editing, auto color and image correction, multi-camera editing, and more. Premiere Pro is a favorite among people, making original hybrid hybrids and creations from a collection of other videos, but the tool is just as effective when it comes to editing your own creations. This week's Honorable Mention comes out on Lightworks (Windows), a free, open source, and incredibly powerful editing tool with remarkable file format support.
