☐ Aisle - free exit accessway that defines and provides a path of egress travel	
☐ Connector - manufactured device used to join two building components	
☐ Exit - a fire-rated, separated path from the exit access to the exit discharge	
☐ Fastener - nail, screw, bolt, or anchor	
☐ Fire wall - fire-rated wall that stands and protects either side of the wall in case of fire destruction	
☐ Grade plane - average finished ground level adjoining the exterior of the building
