INTRODUCTION

"For the seed shall be prosperous; the vine shall give its fruit, and the ground shall give its increase, and the heavens shall give their dew; and I will cause the remnant of this to possess all these things."

Zechariah 8:12

This booklet will share how naming your seed grows just like the natural seed that we plant. Our natural seeds have a name, and it grows as it is planted, watered, and nurtured. I have seen how God has blessed every one of my seeds spiritually sown and how they have brought forth a harvest in its due season.

When I learned about seedtime and harvest, I had a need. I had a small seed, and I had big faith, so I named my seed and sowed it with faith, and my need was met. This began my journey of the revelation and power of "Name That Seed." I began to live my life as

a sower. God gives seed to the sower. I am a sower, and God always gives me seed to sow. I sow seed with a purpose in mind, and that purpose has a name. It's a principle; Jesus was a seed to meet a need, and God sowed Him and named Him Savior. It is according to your faith, be it done unto you. God's Word (seed) does not return unto Him void, but it accomplishes everything that pleases Him. If we ask anything in His name, it will be done! (*John 14:14*). I pray this booklet will be a blessing to you. Start naming your seed and see the manifestation come forth in Jesus' name.

CHAPTER 1

NAME THAT SEED

"Then God said, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the surface of all the earth, and every tree which has fruit yielding seed; it shall be food for you."

Genesis 1:29

Webster's Dictionary defines *seed* as the grains or ripened ovules of plants used for sowing. The KJV Dictionary defines *seed* as that from which anything springs; first principle; original; as the seeds of virtue or vice.

Name That Seed! What is a seed? A seed is symbolic of and embodies multiple meanings. The symbolic meaning of a seed can be represented in many forms, such as in the figure of a monetary offering. A seed is symbolically given towards anything that you personally

desire or acts as an avenue to satisfy such desires.

In the physical realm of things, we often want the harvest, but a process must occur to reap a harvest. For instance, if you want to have a vegetable garden, you don't just wake up one day and say it, expecting to walk to your backyard, and like magic, the vegetable garden is there. First, you have to purchase the seeds of the vegetables that you would like to have. You have to prepare to put the seeds into the soil, which means you have to have the proper garden tools and amount of water. Then you start the actual sowing process.

Now from a biblical perspective, you want to decide what you want the Lord to manifest to you by planting that seed. Once you have asked the Lord precisely what you want Him to do for you, then you must take action. Sometimes it might be uncomfortable, but that is where your faith and trust in God come in. You have your tithes (10%) or your offering (which is the

excess of how you want to be a blessing), which is considered a seed. Sometimes you might be required to sow a seed at a time where your finances don't line up. You are giving that seed in faith, believing God will multiply it. As the scripture says in Luke 6:38, "Give and it will be given to you, a good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into you. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." We plant that seed ("name the seed"), and we wait to see it multiply. In waiting, we pray, decree, and speak over that seed, waiting for its full harvest in due season.

A seed can be given as an offering in a church or outside the church to other ministries or organizations. A physical seed can be represented by a person planting it into the life of another person. For instance, it can be a physical, symbolic representation through the gifting of your time: blessing someone with a ride to church or the grocery store with needed clothing, furniture, and/or money. Also, by the

spirit, through interceding in prayer for someone in relation to health, wellness, salvation, prosperity, and wealth.

As you read earlier, this compares and contrasts the difference between a physical seed and a spiritual seed. The process is similar; God uses the natural as an example for the spiritual, and as we operate in those principles, we will see the manifestations of it.

Our Lord blessed me with a profound revelation for why it is important to name your seed! In 1998, on one particular morning before attending church service, the Lord showed me Genesis 8:22 during my prayer time. He said to me, "As long as the earth remains, there will be seedtime and harvest." This is the reason why it was so important for me to begin naming my seed. The Lord blessed me with this new revelation, along with my testimony, which occurred later that morning during the service. On that day, my launching pad, to be consistent in naming my seed, became a reality. I started

sowing my seed when I was in my 20's and still today, in my 50's I have seen God's favor upon my life continuously. It started back then, and it still happens even now!

In 1998 I lived with my family in Connecticut; I was a mother of three small children and a housewife to my now ex-husband. He supplied me with an allowance to maintain the household, such as groceries and comparable matters. However, to maintain my revelation of naming my seed with whatever money I received, I would tithe whatever money was leftover from the allowance. There was a specific timeframe where I had the desire to attend a particular marriage banquet. I felt this banquet would help my challenged marriage. I was certain if I made a request for my husband to purchase the tickets, that he would not be interested nor understand the value behind attending such a marriage banquet. Being the praying woman that I am, I petitioned God to make a way where I would be blessed with a pair of tickets to the marriage banquet. I only

had fifty cents, yet confidently I told the Lord that I would name my fifty-cent seed to be blessed with the tickets. As the church service proceeded, my pastor at that time released a word to the congregation stating that "...someone is here that prayed about the marriage banquet tickets."

As the pastor was releasing what she had just heard from the Lord, I was not paying any mind to what she had just said because I was distracted by my young children. So the pastor repeated herself, saying, "...I know you are here because God just told me so!" In amazement upon clearly hearing this, I jumped up and loudly responded, "That's me!!! That's me!!!" At that point, my pastor released a word to me. She said, "Woman of God since you had faith and trusted God, He asked me to tell you that every seed you name He will bring it to pass for you!" She went on to say that "...every time you give your tithes and offerings, and name your seed, it will bring everything to pass." After my pastor released that word to me, she

handed me the marriage banquet tickets! Needless to say, I was astonished by God's immediate faithfulness!

Ever since that time, I have been dedicated to naming my seed. God is performing the miraculous in my life. God did it for my family and me, and He can do it for you! You have to believe it! You have to speak it! God will do the rest!

When giving your tithe and offerings, remain mindful of the significance of speaking to your seed in whatever form your seed may represent. Remain patient and watch the favor of God manifest and come forth through the planting of your seed.

CHAPTER 2

WHAT ARE YOU NAMING YOUR SEED?

Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap.

Galatians 6:7 (NKJV)

Sowing and reaping is a universal principle. Once you name and sow your seed, you shall surely reap it! All seeds have a harvest, so what seeds are you sowing?

When planted in the soil, a seed has a specific name, designed to produce a specific product, such as an apple tree or an orange tree. God said to be specific when you name your seed. His Word says to declare and pray in supplication. Philippians 4:6-7 AMP states, “Do not be anxious or worried about anything, but in everything [every circumstance and situation] by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving,

continue to make your [specific] requests known to God. And the peace of God [that peace which reassures the heart, that peace] which transcends all understanding, [that peace which] stands guard over your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus [is yours].”

As you would do in prayer, be specific! When naming a monetary seed, I consistently indicate my seed or seeds' name on my tithes and offerings envelope, including dates in which I would desire for my seed to manifest. This is how I relate to God and how He responds to me. For instance, I continue to name my seeds for my family's salvation, extended family members, friends, and promotion for myself. However, in the past and as a consistent practice now, I write my seed's name, no matter the situation! Of course, in terms of time, the manifestation is always within God's timing. Whether it manifests on my set target date or not, I do not doubt that my seed will come to pass!

Charles Capps, the author of *God's Creative Power for Finances*, shared in his book that he negatively spoke over his natural seed for nearly two years. Capps did this because the crop seeds he had planted in the ground were not producing the harvest.

He felt distraught and frustrated due to the outcome. After expressing disdain for the seemingly failed crops, God spoke to him, asking, "What are you doing?" Charles replied to the Lord, "I am praying." Nevertheless, Capps continued to release negative words over the natural crops. He even had negative thoughts. The result was that words released over the crops contrary to God's Word were exactly what was produced based on his negative and doubt-filled words and thoughts. With this type of mindset, Capps witnessed no manifestation and no harvest of the physical crop! A change in mind and spirit must take place for positive results to happen.

This is why it is so crucial for us to name our seed! Speak to your Seed! To name your seed is the same as to water and cultivate a natural seed that is planted in soil. In the past as well as the present, my seeds surely manifest!

To encourage anyone reading this book, I would like to share a few examples of my manifested seedtime and harvest. I watered, cultivated, and specifically asked God for the following until it came to fruition.

✓ My youngest son Jordon was accepted into the United States Air Force, and only seven out of thirty-five candidates were accepted. I asked God if this was my son's destiny, and I would write on my seed, "Jordan in the Air Force."

✓ My daughter Jasmine was honored with a Full Academic Scholarship at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland.

✓ My eldest son Joshua was blessed with a Full Academic Scholarship, including room and board at Carlton University in Northfield, Minnesota. Additionally, he is a recent recipient of a second full scholarship as an MBA candidate at the University of Massachusetts.

- For my personal promotion – I graduated in December 2019 as an honor student, and may I add that it was said, “with certain academic challenges.” In my undergrad classes, I have never received high grades. During my youth, I was a “C” student. I began to pray what God says about me and my memory. Since then, I went from being a “C” student to an “A” student! This is only by God’s grace and His faithfulness! As you name your seed, speak to because God is faithful! I consistently named my seed as a graduate student. My seed

produced a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.7 out of 4.0 grading scale as I concluded my studies.

- In February 2018, I received my Honorary Doctorate in Divinity for a life of humanitarian services. In 2014, I gave a seed as I began to name my honorary doctorate degree. I wasn't thinking about actually continuing work to obtain my Ph.D.

When residing in Connecticut, preceding my divorce from my first husband, I would name my seed for a husband, the one God designed for me, to come forth. Written on my seed, be it my offering envelope or in my journal, I would also remind God of what His Word says about what a godly husband and a covenant marriage should be.

So, I would say to the Lord: "You said my husband should be my priest, king, lover, best friend, provider, and protector! Many years later, even after missing perceived opportunities, my manifested seed appeared in

the man named Dwain K. Speese. He was my husband, my priest, my king, my lover, my best friend, my provider, and my protector! Thank you, my Lord, for my manifested seed!

Now that Is the favor Of God!!! This is not an exhaustive list of my manifested seeds. I encourage you to name, speak to, water, and relentlessly cultivate your seed with His promises in His Word!

I have many journals and different vision boards with answered prayers of naming my seed to keep a running log of when and how God manifested that particular seed.

CHAPTER 3

STAND ON YOUR SEED

“But those who wait on the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.”

Isaiah 40:31 (NIV)

Just because a seed has been planted doesn't mean that it automatically grows. In other words, there's work to do.

- Labor with your seed.
- Water your seed.
- Cultivate your seed until your desire comes forth.
- Don't faint !!!

Believers speak life into the situation! Later in his book, *God's Creative Power for Finances*,

Charles Capps gained the revelation that he needed to change his mindset. Capps did not grow weary, neither did he faint; instead, he spoke life to the physical crops. He applied God's words over the crops, calling forth the crops by name. As the Lord promised, the crops began to spring forth and produced a harvest as the crops were specifically designed.

“Cast your bread upon the waters, for you will find it after many days” (Ecclesiastes 11:1a).

“Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over shall they give into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you” (Luke 6:38 ASV).

“God knows the end before the beginning” (Isaiah 46:10a).

In February 2016, God laid it on my heart to write this book. I pushed past fear and procrastination! Regardless of the fear, God always has the final say! The Holy Spirit is the blueprint for our lives, and Jesus Christ is the

author and the finisher of our faith. By our faith, we shall receive. By faith, you plant, sow and receive the harvest. Don't give up nor give in! God is the gardener. We are the planters. The soil is righteousness. What you plant, water with the Word of God. Your words are the final cultivator, and it shall spring forth.

Keep this in your heart; what is for you is for you! What's in your heart is specifically designed just for you. Expect BIG, and you shall receive BIG! Challenge your previous and current level of expectation. If you held an expectation on one level, go to the next higher level or even far beyond your current expectation. Think greater! Expect greater! Receive greater than your present expectations (Ephesians 3:20)! When it is time to plant a seed for a desire to come to fruition, think and expect far beyond your own thoughts. Think from the perspective of what His Word says. "Now [remember] this: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows [a]generously [that blessings may come to

others] will also reap [b]generously [and be blessed] (2 Corinthians 9:6 AMP).” Webster’s dictionary defines bountiful as abundant, plentiful, fruitful, or generously given. Sparingly is defined as a deficiency or limited in quantity fullness or extent. When you give with a pure heart, trust in God’s word that your return will be bountiful.

God’s word says that some shall receive 30, 60, or 100 fold (Matthew 13:8). As a man thinketh, so is he (Proverbs 23:7). How are you thinking? What are you thinking? Align your thoughts with God’s word (Philippians 4:8). Know that God’s promises for your life are yea and amen (2 Corinthians 1:20). His promises for our lives revolve around various circumstances that are designed to lead us towards our purposes; therefore, our seeds will be covered by various prayers and declarations to address our purpose. When naming your seed for a specific circumstance, trust that God shall always provide specific scriptures to address particular needs.

God has already made a way for you from the moment He created you in the womb. God's purpose for our life and destiny is uniquely designed. Believe that He does not favor one person over another. His will and purpose for our life will surely come to fruition in His divine order and time.

CHAPTER 4

GOD IS NO RESPECTER OF PERSONS

“God is not a man, that He should lie, nor a son of man, that He should repent. Has He said, and will He not do it? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?”

Numbers 23:19 (NIV)

Everything is in divine order and alignment with God's will for your life. When you plant a natural seed such as watermelon, grape, strawberry, tomato, or vine seed, it will always produce a harvest. This type of harvest is the same as when we plant spiritual or material seeds. Due to my great faith in God, I have witnessed Him perform miraculous things in my life and that of my family. God can do anything but fail! What God has promised you, it shall happen!

In the Old Testament, God said to Abraham, “No, Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac; I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant and with his descendants after him... at this set time next year” (Genesis 17:19-21).

Despite God’s promise to Abraham and Sarah, Sarah grew impatient regarding God’s timing as to when she would conceive a son. Her doubt increased. Sarah’s doubt became so great that the angel’s message did not bear any weight. Her story in the scripture shows us how her impatience resulted in a horrible decision. Sarah decided that it was best to take the matter into her own hands. She intentionally ignored the consequences of not waiting for God’s perfect timing. Sarah’s increased impatience persuaded her to present her slave, Hagar, to be with her husband, Abraham, where the two agreed to conceive a son (Genesis 16:1-16). Sarah believed that Hagar was much younger than she was and thus had a better chance to become pregnant. Sarah wrestled with her doubt and

unbelief in God's message that she became deceived, and she did not believe that she could bring forth the promise. As a result of Sarah's decision, Abraham and Hagar bore a son, and his name was Ishmael.

As believers, when waiting on God to resolve an issue or even provide a needed revelation on how best to handle a situation, at times, we may find ourselves growing in levels of impatience. Although we see how Sarah's decision concluded, we may still have the tendency not to wait on God's perfect timing to bring resolution to our situation through His promise. If the manifestation of your desire does not come in your timing, it is essential to not grow impatient; but to remain faithful and hold steadfast to the promises of His word. I encourage you not to enter into the flesh and cause things to occur within a man's timeframe in order to manufacture a quicker resolution and make God's timing second.

When God makes a promise, we should not

make our will greater than His will. God does not require our assistance. He needs our faith, trust, and patience. All He wants from us and expects of His people is to rejoice and put Him in the remembrance of His word. If God has done it for Sarah, Abraham, and me, He shall surely do it for you! God is our great shepherd (Psalm 23:1). It is our job to silence the enemy by speaking what God says in His word; therefore, the enemy must flee! Recall that Peter walked on water with Jesus. Now it is your turn to do the same. Look to hills from whence cometh your help (Psalm 121:1-2).
