Grace and Thorne Sansevieria's \$19 Shop Traditional Favorite should be spathiphyllum, Lily's beautiful world that offers elegant white blooms contrasting with lush green foliage, says Davis. There is something about the name Lilly World that exudes calmness and serenity too. Bakker World Lily's \$7 Shop is an air-cleaning favorite. It offers instant pop green, Davis says. Bertie's Patch Middle Boston Fern \$16 Shop Trailing Ivy, either a mottled sheet or full on green, is an excellent option that can also double as a function of the statement in the room when placed in hanging pots. Think of the bathroom, living room or hallway, davis suggests. Patch Trail Ivy \$6 Shop Davis recommends planting your Ivy Trail in macrame knitted hangers. The higher the value, the faster, but not necessarily more carefully - the machine filters the air. HEPA, the same type of filter that traps dust in vacuum cleaners. In an air filter room, HEPA can capture very small particles by airborne droplets before they settle. Asthma and Allergy Friendly, a relatively new certification from the Asthma and Allergy Foundation. Only a few units have earned it so far, proving that they reduce (and not just redistribute) allergens. What to miss ozone: Some machines that may be marketed as air fresheners, generate ozone for its sweet-smelling flavor. Don't buy these: Ozone is a known lung irritant.
