Donald Trump's campaign has been unable to explain how the Republican presidential nominee's assets are worth \$40 million less than he claimed on his financial disclosure forms. The New York Times revealed on Sunday that a review of his tax returns showed Trump earned a little over \$1 million in 2009, just four years ago, making him the only candidate in the 2016 field of Republicans without a year in which he has made more than \$10,000 in income. The Wall Street Journal reported that the checks Trump has cashed have been endorsed by casinos, hotels and other business partners. In contrast to the way Trump described himself in the disclosure forms, Trump told the Times he earned \$100 million or more in 2015 and could not properly determine how much he earned on the campaign trail. In both 2009 and 2015, Trump paid a lower effective tax rate than his income would suggest. The Times noted that Trump's 2013 tax returns showed the Republican paid \$31 million to his tax lawyers, while the rest of the \$153 million he said he made in 2015 went into personal expenses.

Ryan Peters Ryan Peters is a member of the South Dakota House of Representatives, representing District 31 since January 9, 2013. He is a Democrat. Peters attended the University of Nebraska–Lincoln, earning a degree in economics in 1996. In 1998, he earned a Master's degree in economics from the University of South Dakota. Electoral history 2014 Peters was unopposed for the November 4, 2014 general election. 2012 Peters was unopposed for the September 12, 2012 Democratic primary, winning with 3,066 votes, and won the November 6, 2012 general election with 6,972 votes (71.5%) against Republican nominee Nancy Van Patten. 2010 Peters was unopposed for the September 22, 2010 Democratic primary, winning with 3,078 votes, and won the three-way November 2, 2010 general election with 7,270 votes (59.4%) against Republican nominee Michael Pitt and Constitution nominee Charles Riegle. 2008 Peters was unopposed for the September 9, 2008 Democratic primary, winning with 5,178 votes, and won the November 4, 2008 general election with 7,156 votes (79.4%) against Republican nominee Jason Bond. 2006 Peters was unopposed for the September 12, 2006 Democratic primary, winning with 3,190 votes, and won the November 7, 2006 general election with 5,520fdb1ae7
