
game. We'll have a table at the tree lighting event in the Old Gym (Nov. 24) where kids can decorate sugar cookies."



ST. JOHN PAUL II LITURGICAL CENTER UPDATE

On October 7, we celebrate the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary commemorating the victory at the battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. This victory is attributed to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Therefore, the month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. St. John Paul II was known for his deep Marian devotion and on various occasions he was encouraging all to pray the Rosary. In October 2002, he proclaimed the Year of the Rosary in his Apostolic Letter *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*. First, he answers some objections raised against the Rosary:



Perhaps too, there are some who fear that the Rosary is somehow unecumenical because of its distinctly Marian character. Yet the Rosary clearly belongs to the kind of veneration of the Mother of God described by the Council: a devotion directed to the Christological centre of the Christian faith, in such a way that "when the Mother is honoured, the Son ... is duly known, loved and glorified" (Dogmatic Constitution on the Church Lumen Gentium, 66). If properly revitalized, the Rosary is an aid and certainly not a hindrance to ecumenism! (Rosarium Virginis Mariae, 4)

Then he writes about actuality of this prayer:

Many signs indicate that still today the Blessed Virgin desires to exercise through this same prayer that maternal concern to which the dying Redeemer entrusted, in the person of the beloved disciple, all the sons and daughters of the Church: "Woman, behold your son!" (Jn19:26). Well-known are the occasions in the nineteenth and the twentieth centuries on which the Mother of Christ made her presence felt and her voice heard, in order to exhort the People of God to this form of contemplative prayer. I would mention in particular, on account of their great influence on the lives of Christians and the authoritative recognition they have received from the Church, the apparitions of Lourdes and of Fatima;(11) these shrines continue to be visited by great numbers of pilgrims seeking comfort and hope. (Rosarium Virginis Mariae, 7)

And from the witnesses he gives let us just quote what he says about Blessed Bartolo Longo:

As a true apostle of the Rosary, Blessed Bartolo Longo had a special charism. His path to holiness rested on an inspiration heard in the depths of his heart: "Whoever spreads the Rosary is saved!" As a result, he felt called to build a Church dedicated to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary in Pompei, against the background of the ruins of the ancient city, which scarcely heard the proclamation of Christ before being buried in 79 A.D. during an eruption of Mount Vesuvius, only to emerge centuries later from its ashes as a witness to the lights and shadows of classical civilization. By his whole life's work and especially by the practice of the "Fifteen Saturdays", Bartolo Longo promoted the Christocentric and contemplative heart of the Rosary, and received great encouragement and support from Leo XIII, the "Pope of the Rosary." (Rosarium Virginis Mariae, 8)



STEFAN NORBLIN ART DECO POSTER EXHIBIT


