2) Provincial Grand Chapter



On Saturday 15th April some 196 Companions including a galaxy of Grand Superintendents, Deputies, Provincial Principals and other representatives from both near and far, gathered in No. 1 Lodge Room at Freemasons Hall, Kings Heath for our Annual Convocation. What an excellent day it turned out to be.

After greeting all the Guests and Rulers of the other Orders in the Province the Companions then stood in tribute to Departed Merit and so sadly in the Year 01.01.2022 – 31.12.2022 some 26 Companions Passed to the Grand Chapter above, including one of our Past Grand Superintendents, Richard Brian Ward Price. In mentioning his name our Grand Superintendent mentioned the recent Passing of the Deputy, Charles E S Harris, **PGSwdB**.

Following the receipt of the reports from the Provincial Grand Scribe Ezra and the Registrar, who drew attention to our current membership where, in the past 12 months we have lost some 30 Companions. The MEGS made comment on that in his address later in the Convocation. The

Treasurer then gave his report where he had to announce that the Annual Provincial Subscription would need to rise by £1 in the year commencing 1st January 2024.

There then followed the necessary Administrative Elections before what to many is the main items on the Agenda, the Appointments and Promotions.

The MEGS had no hesitation in re-appointing as Deputy Grand Superintendent, E. Comp. Michael D Cox, **PGSwdB**.



And followed this by re-appointing E. Comp. Tim M L Jones, **PGStB**, as the 2nd Provincial Grand Principal



Following this the Provincial DC presented E. Comp. Stephen N. Middleditch, PPrGSN, as the 3rd Provincial Grand Principal Elect who was then Installed in an excellent manner by the outgoing 3rd Provincial Grand Principal E. Comp. Keith M Evans, **PGStB**,



who, in his 20 months service in that Office had attended some 60 Installations within the Province as well as his other duties in a number of Orders.

E. Comp. Stephen then took his rightful place in the Chapter Room.



The MEGS then presented E. Comp. Keith with his Past Provincial 3rd Grand Principals Collarette



This was then followed by the Appointment of this year's Acting Officers followed by the Appointment of Past Ranks and Promotions.

As is the prerogative of the MEGS he then announced his choice of Companions to receive his Certificate of Merit.



This year his choices were.- E. Comp. Roger Hall-Jones, PPrGSN of Royd's Chapter C1204 whose cv proved quite remarkable for his work in Local Government, Charities and a Masonic career of some magnitude and E. Comp. Ken R. Hingley, PPrGSwdB, of Chapter of Dudley C252, who again had enjoyed an interesting business career and had been one of the main contributors to the conversion of the Stourbridge Temperance Hall to what is now the very well refurbished James S Webb Freemasons Centre.

The next item was the MEGS Address where he focused on the future, inviting every Companion to consider assisting in the Retention and Recruiting of members, not forgetting those who for whatever reason have become unattached. To this end an Invitation Card was provided for every member of the Province present to encourage them to become involved in the campaign.

4. New Initiatives

1.At the Annual Convocation on 15 April the MEGS in his address mentioned two initiatives for the forthcoming year.

- The Grand Sanhedrin
- The Archway to Improvement

These initiatives are designed to bolster our membership and amplify our enjoyment of this beautiful order.

It is perhaps worthwhile explaining a little bit more about both.

1.The Grand Sanhedrin is a meeting of all Chapters once a year to discuss how they are getting on and to share best practice. The invitation is aimed at the Z , Scribe E and last exalted Companion of each Chapter to join with the MEGS and his Executive and to discuss what meetings they are holding ; what candidates they are attracting and how they are going about attracting new candidates ; the support they want

from Province; to foster the idea of visiting and to address any matters which the individual Chapters want to bring to the meeting. The aim is to hold the first Grand Sanhedrin on Saturday 30 September 2023 at Kings Heath at 10.30am. It will be a very relaxed meeting and the MEGS is hoping for a good attendance. 2. The Archway to Improvement is a peer learning group aimed at all Royal Arch Masons who are curious to know more about this beautiful order. The aim is to hold 4 meetings each year in Kings Heath, Worcester, Kidderminster, and Malvern (all being well); to have a presentation at each meeting and a discussion following the presentation about all things Royal Arch. The presentations will vary in their complexity with the aim being to provide a real understanding of what Royal Arch Masonry is all about, the story the players and its significance. Again, this will be a very relaxed occasion, mufti being the order of the day. More news will follow once we have finalised the speakers, topics, and venues. - Chapter assistance by the Provincial Officers, how it works and how to access it.
- A question-and-answer session, to deal with any Royal Arch related queries that attending Companions may have.
