Thanks again to everyone who participated, and to Jody who coordinated the project and quilted it. The colors, design, and block patterns are wonderful! I even love the back!

Elsewhere in the newsletter you will see the list of upcoming workshops and programs. We have most of the spots filled for the coming year. The input from the survey helped us to choose our speakers and workshops. Thanks to all the 21 persons who participated. Those of you who didn't participate didn't take advantage of the chance to let us know what you like and don't like about our guild, suggestions for improvement, and what your guilting interests are.

Coming up soon are the following: International Quilt Festival in Long Beach, July 26-29; "Make Me Smile" Challenge due Aug. 2; and Quilt Daze IX August 18 and 19. (I hope we get a lot of participants in our challenge. If we do, we will plan a new challenge every 3 or 4 months.)



2012 Acacia Challenge

Have you thought about what you will enter in the 2012 Challenge?

Theme: "Make Us Smile"

Purpose: Create a challenge quilt that makes the viewer laugh out loud, giggle a little or at least smile. We all seem to take some things too seriously lately. Please keep it clean, have fun, and be creative! Due Date: AUGUST 2nd at our GUILD MEETING. Each challenge quilt will be voted on by our members, then they will be displayed at "Quilt Daze IX" on August 18 and 19.

Rules:

#1—HAVE FUN!!! Hopefully you'll do a lot of laughing while you're creating your challenge. Use your imagination! Your creation can be traditional or contemporary, but please keep it clean.

#2—Finished Size: The standard finished size for the challenge of 24" in each direction. Any challenge that does not fit the requirements will be disqualified. (Quilt does not have to be square, but the height and the width must be 24" at the highest and widest points). The quilt could be a circle or hexagon or have something (such as flowers or animals) extending beyond the rest of the quilt to still finish at 24".

#3—Item Selection: Only small quilts or wall hangings measuring 24" high and wide will be accepted. Please no tote bags, pocket books, vests, jackets, etc.

#4—Methods of Construction: Use the construction or quilting methods that work best for your creation (i.e., machine piece, hand piece, paper piece, appliqué, collage, etc.). We encourage you to challenge yourself. Your creation can be as complex or as simple as you like.

#5—Quilting Requirement: We would like you to create this item yourself, so no professional quilting unless you own your own long-arm machine. You can hand or machine quilt your item.

#6—Fabric Requirement: There is no limit to the total number of fabrics or kinds of fabrics used.

#7—Embellishments: Optional.

#8—Hanging Sleeve: The quilt back must have a hanging sleeve at least 3" wide. The sleeve should be around 1" narrower than the 24" finished width. We will be hanging the challenge quilts at Quilt Daze along with other member quilts.

#9—Label: Put a label with your name on the back of your creation so it cannot be seen during judging. We need the label so we can return the challenge item to you after the show.

Ribbons will be given to the top five winners.
