


# WHAT?

Teenagers and pre-teens are turning to the social networking website for answers to everyday questions and even help when it comes to romance. But parents can't always be there to guard their children against predators who might try to use it to try to seduce their offspring. So parent information company Perfect Match is launching the first in a series of books for kids as young as eight called Facebook 101. The books will focus on appropriate topics for children and will be packed with information about friends, online romance, privacy and safety. They will be written by Dr Charlie Jarvis, who has had 30 years experience working with children. "We know that children really enjoy this kind of stuff and it's something they don't always get access to from their parents," Dr Jarvis told AAP. "We've written these books specifically for them to get their questions answered and to also be able to understand a lot of the terms that are used on Facebook." Dr Jarvis said the books were designed to give children a sense of what was going on when they were away from home and trusted an adult to explain it to them. "The best way of learning about any topic is talking about it. We wanted to use Facebook as a medium to help kids understand Facebook and have a look at Facebook in a different way. "This is designed for them to be able to get a bit of understanding of what it's about," he said. The first book is called What's the Point of Facebook? and has four chapters covering friends, privacy, bullying and dating. The next book will be How to Stop Being a Facebookee and will look at a range of safety issues including privacy, cyber bullying and email scams. The third book is called How to Deal with a Crush, and explains all about romance, friendship and what's really happening online. There are several Facebook safety tips for parents including educating children about the site, monitoring their use, paying attention to the information their children share, and talking about safety issues.
