### March

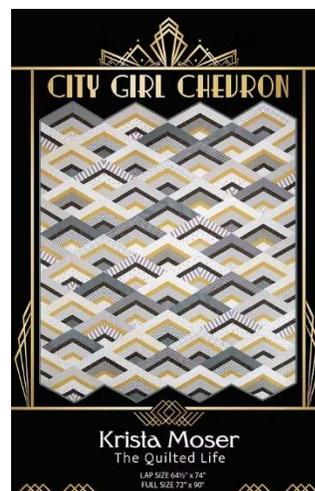

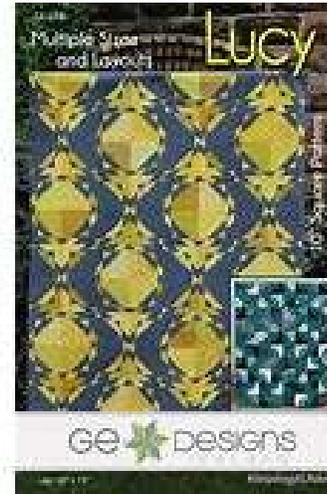
Krista will have lots of merchandise available at both the presentation and workshops.

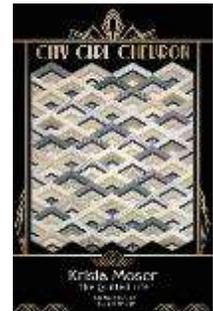
**Directions:** From the 22 Freeway, exit Euclid St. Go north. The church is just past Chapman Ave. on the right. There is plenty of parking at the rear.

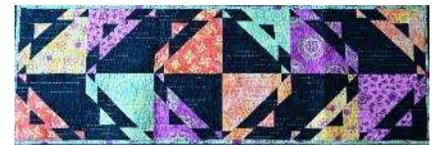


April 9<sup>th</sup>: **Lucy** by Zina Clark

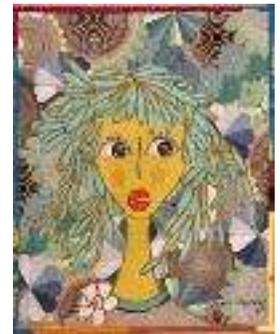

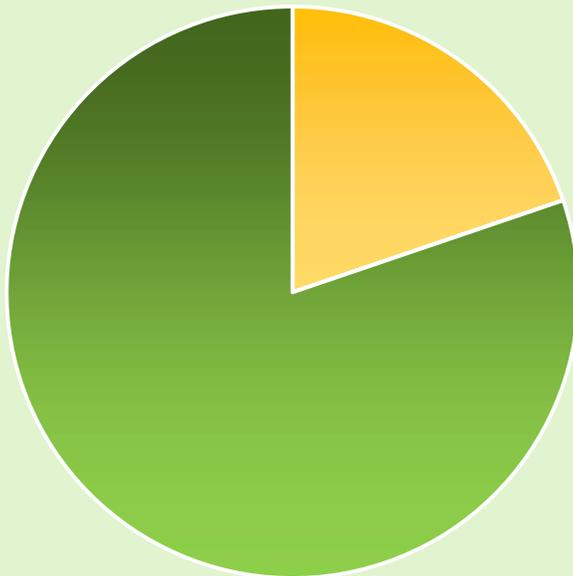



### Signature Quilts History

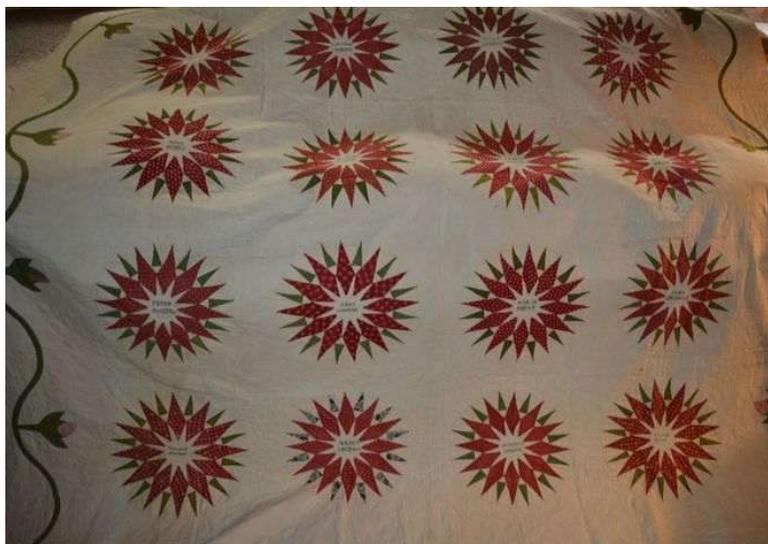
Signature quilts, as we understand them today, became popular in the 1830's. They grew out of the expansion West. They were given as gifts to family members who were moving West, and unlikely to ever be seen again as the journey was too far for families to visit one another.

The Civil War found another use for the signature quilt, raising funds to help the soldiers. Signature quilts were made, a fee charged to add a signature and then the quilt was raffled off, sometimes then donated back to the cause and raffled off again. They were also used to help fund and support the temperance and suffrage movements.

Signature quilts were also made to commemorate someone and thank them, as OGQG is doing with this quilt.

Today signature quilts are sometimes used as a genealogy tool to find out relations as well as vicinity. Old inks often damaged the fabric, today we are fortunate to have readily available pigment pens that do not damage quilts.

Consider adding your hand in making this signature quilt, as well as your signature. Who knows someday someone may look you up to see who you were.

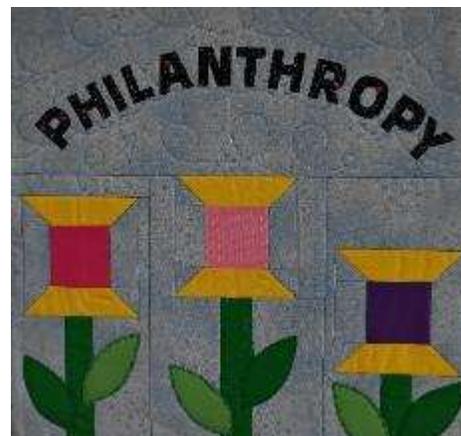


## Philanthropy

Over the years there have been many donations of panels, finished blocks, cut squares of many sizes, uncompleted quilts, etc. I'm having fun going through it all and deciding what to do with it. I'm turning some into quilt kits but need red, lime and apple green, yellow, orange, pink and royal blue fabrics, solids or small print to complete them. If you have ½ to 1 yard pieces in those colors, I would appreciate them.



The next Sew Day will be March 4<sup>th</sup> at the Driftwood Mobile Home Park, 15621 Beach Blvd., Westminster. We meet from about 9:30-2:00. Come anytime during the day and bring a sack lunch if you wish to eat with us.

**Come join us to work, eat lunch, and socialize.**

If thinning your stash consider donating to philanthropy, the following yardages are needed:

- ½ to 1 yard by width of fabric of solids or small prints
  - Red
  - Lime and apple green
  - Yellow
  - Orange
  - Pink
  - Royal blue
- 2+ yard by width of fabric pieces for backings especially needed are children's colors/designs
- 27 inch by 40-44-inch pieces for pillow cases (children's fabrics and soft)


