Old Testament Reading

Ezekiel 37:1-14

The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." Then he said to me, "Prophecy over these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD."

So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I prophesied, there was a sound, and behold, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. And I looked, and behold, there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them. But there was no breath in them. Then he said to me, "Prophecy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to the breath, Thus says the Lord GOD: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they may live." So I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army.

Then he said to me, "Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. Behold, they say, 'Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are clean cut off.' Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I will open your graves and raise you from your graves, O my people.

And I will bring you into the land of Israel. And you shall know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves, and raise you from your graves, O my people. And I will put my Spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you in your own land. Then you shall know that I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will do it, declares the LORD.”

1 John 5:4–10

St. John 20:19–31

Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.” And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld.”

Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, “We have seen the Lord.” But he said to them, “Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe.”

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

About the Hymn of the Day – O Sons and Daughters of the King – LSB 470-71 You can take your Bible out and check out the Scriptural references in our Hymn of the Day. Our Hymns are grounded in the Scriptures and so we sing what is most sure and certain.

Author Jean Tisserand (d. ca. 1497), a Franciscan friar, was a popular Parisian preacher who founded a home for wayward girls around 1492. Several of his writings appeared in print during the decades following his death, one of which, published sometime between 1518 and 1536, contained this hymn. Originally in nine stanzas, this "Alleluia for the day of Easter" was subsequently expanded by an anonymous author to twelve, with the story of Thomas and his doubts about the resurrected Jesus receiving additional attention. The hymn's popularity continued to increase, and it is still sung today in Latin in Catholic churches that retain that language.

This abridged harmony of the resurrection narratives employs all four canonical Gospels. The emphasis, though, is clearly on the Gospel according to St. John; in particular, Jesus' words and actions concerning the faith of Thomas. Stanza 1 begins with the triumphant message of Jesus' resurrection. The third line, "morte surrexit hodie" ("today He arose from death"), is based on Revelation 20:13, although the "sting" in this line's English translation is from 1 Corinthians

15:55-56. The message is clear: the resurrection of Jesus impels the children of God to glorify their heavenly King.

In the second through fourth stanzas, Tisserand included two distinct accounts of the resurrection. In the second and third stanzas, an angel in white appears to the women at the open tomb. The “three women” noted in the third stanza are Mary Magdelene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, as recounted in Mark 16:1 (the three are explicitly named in the original Latin) The four Gospels contain numerous words of the angel(s) at the tomb, but only “the Lord is in Galilee” (Matthew 28:10, Mark 16:7) is included here. In the fourth stanza, Jesus appears to the apostles, who were hiding behind closed doors. Of all that Jesus said on this occasion, only “Peace to all of you” (John 20:19,21) is incorporated into the hymn.

The fifth through eighth stanzas paraphrase John 20:24-29. Notable components of this narrative are absent: Thomas’s demand to see the marks of the crucifixion (John 20:25), the eight days between stanzas five and six (John 20:26), and the second appearance of Jesus to the apostles behind closed doors (John 20:26). The biblical narrative refers only to the marks of the crucifixion on Jesus’ hands and side (John 20:25,27), but Tisserand exercises his poetic license in adding the marks in Jesus’ feet (stanzas 6 and 7). Stanza 8 is based on John 20:29, where Jesus says that those who have not seen yet remain firm in their faith are blessed. The stanza adds that these faithful shall win eternal life, incorporating John 20:31.

The concluding stanza shows the correlation between the Old and New Testaments. “Festo sanctissimo” is here translated “on this most holy day of days.” This shows how the holy days of Leviticus 23:1-44—Sabbath, Passover, Feast of the First Fruits, Feast of Weeks, Feast of Trumpets, Day of Atonement, Feast of Booths—are superseded by the newer and greater celebration of the resurrection of Christ (Hebrews 8:1-13, 10:11-13).

The message of the hymn for us is that Jesus truly did rise from the dead, and this is good news for all to believe. Even those who have not seen their risen Lord with their eyes or touched Him with their hands can trust in the message of those who did see and touch the flesh of Jesus raised from the dead (1 Corinthians 15:5-8). *Lutheran Service Book, Companion to the Hymns, Vol. 1.
