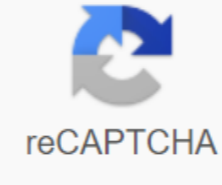




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Corner pergola plans pdf

The wooden pergolas give this brick house some character. Building pergola is a great way to provide shade in your backyard by allowing air to circulate. Here's how to do it: Set Arbor Messages: Use a post hole excavator to dig holes in the ground and install 6-on-6 pressure-treated wooden pillars in concrete. Check local building codes to make sure the holes are deep enough for your climate. Cut Arbor Messages: Once the concrete is installed, use a circular saw to cut the tops of the posts at the desired height so that they are level with each other. Cut Band Joists: Miter angles a 2-by-10-inch joists band so the distance between the short ends of the miters is the same length as the outer distance between the pillars, or add twice the thickness of the joists (3 inches) to the outer distance between the posts to find the total length of each joist group. Attach Band Joists: Attach a strip of joists around the perimeter posts with nails or screws, so that the tops of the joists are flush from the top of the posts. Strengthen the joints with galvanized lag screws and washers, countersinking holes so lagging screws flush with joists. Cut Arbor Rafters: Cut the 2-by-8 rafters to lengths so they hang strip joists with decorative ogies, or curved S-shapes, cut at one or both ends. Attach Arbor Rafters: The space of the rafters is the pergola of the gazebo on 16-inch centers, and the nails of the bottom of each rafters at the top of the joists band with galvanized nails. Use a string attached to the ends of the outer rafters to level the inner rafters. Attach Stub Rafters: Position the outer rafters flush from the outside of the joists band, and use 3-inch screws to attach short rafters stubs to the outer rafters with the outer ends cut in the same decorative ogy design. These joists are attached toenailing them from both sides in the joist bands under them. To continue the overhang look on the adjacent side we cut out the pieces with a decorative cut at the same length of the overhang. We attach them to the side of the perpendicular joystick with three-door deck screws, driven from the back. This is easier to do if you attach them before installing the last long joist on this side.
