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Conveyor belts are basically very wide straps attached to a loop on two or more snout motors driven by motors. The loop is a real conveyor belt and is usually made of two or more layers of rubber, one layer that gives shape and structure to the strap, and one so that it can carry its load safely. Many times twists or turns are put on the conveyor; They are facilitated by conical rotors or wheels that allow the conveyor to rotate. Training refers to adjusting the straps, idleness and loading conditions of a given strap so that the strap does not remain uncentered. The accumulation of material around the conveyor rollers is the greatest possible problem. One way to avoid these problems is to install a belt scraper so that it constantly clears the belt rollers. In a well-trained conveyor, the strap takes contact with all horizontal rollers to roll the trough idle, and all pulleys and idle rides are at the right angle to the centreline of the conveyor belt. After you complete the installation of the new conveyor, fully charge the conveyor and let it rotate for several hours. At the end of this first day, leave the belt fully loaded overnight. The template will now be saved and ready for use. To find the template the next time you open PowerPoint, click the File tab, and then click New.
