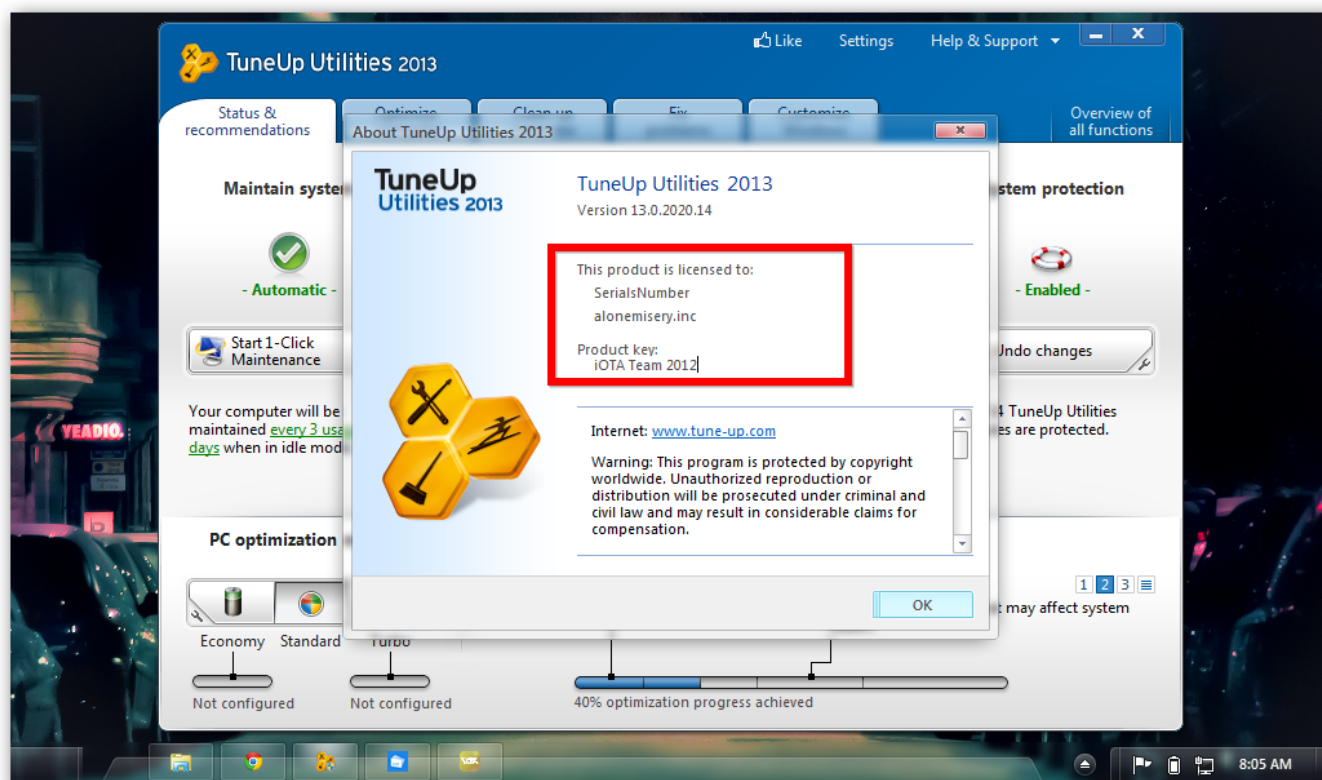

Oldfield, Nature, 1955, 177, 88-91 A disease of the bone, commonly known as 'cherubism', is a familial polyostotic condition affecting both the skull and jaws of young children, characterised by symmetrical hyperostotic, usually monostotic, lesions of the jaws with resorption of alveolar bone. Nature, 1955, 177, 88-91 The disease is named after the cherubs sculpted on the Mona Lisa by Leonardo da Vinci. Cherubism is a self-limiting disease, and the course of the disease can be rapid (ie, in a short period of time) or very slow. The lesions are characterised by an abundant spongy bone with an associated fibro-osseous overgrowth of the jaw. Some lesions may resemble a tumour, and the only curative treatment is surgical resection. The disease commonly starts around the age of 3 years, but may begin at any age. In the past, the average age at presentation was 3-4 years, but the onset has now shifted to a slightly older age group. The disease has an incidence of 1 in 1000,000, and is not related to race or gender. The incidence of the disease has decreased over the last 20 years in the UK, mainly due to changes in the treatment of the condition. A description of the disease was first published by J. M. Oldfield in 1955. The first description of the disease was made by Oldfield in 1955, who published a case study of two young boys with cherubism. The disease was diagnosed after routine examination of the two boys by J. M. Oldfield (Fig. 1) showed that they had several "cherubic-like" lesions in their jaws. The lesions were symmetrical, and both boys showed lesions in their teeth and in the jaw bones. The boys were treated with phenytoin, an antiepileptic drug. 520fdb1ae7
