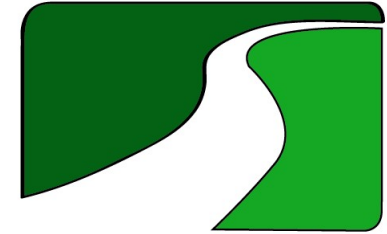

WHO WE ARE

CFFR has been operating as part of a collaborative community group for 10 years.

We partner our response in conjunction with and rely on: the Forest Service Front Country Recreation Crew; area businesses with machinery; Backcountry Horsemen of WA, Whatcom Chapter; and Whatcom Co. Snowmobile Club members and others.

Most volunteer effort is contributed by a core team of four individuals and associates. Turnout varies from the "core team" who are out most every week to individuals who come out a few times a year.

2024 PROJECTS

East Church Rd (FSR 3040) - Manually brushed ditches along 2.5 miles, followed by filling 51 potholes with 10 cu. yards of gravel in a collaborative effort with USFS.

Glacier Creek Rd (FSR 39) - Purchased 56 bags of EZ street asphalt patch for filling potholes in a collaborative effort with Doug Huddle

Wells Creek Rd (FSR 33) - supported Ron Roosma in the brushing/grading from MP 1.3 - 12.0, providing access to the Cougar Divide trailhead. Also did canopy cut-back as well as cleared culverts and ditches below snowline at the end of the year.



WHAT WE DO

CFFR provides the Forest Service with information on road conditions, access, and possible safety hazards.
