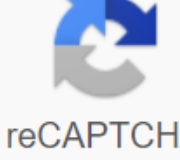

Sparkles1 Page 2 My HP Windows 10 computer has or has had, depending on whether my solution remains working, The Realtek RTL8188EE 802.11 bgn Wi-Fi adapter problem is that the adapter sometimes stops working on and off. My wife kept calling BrightHouse and Netflix to fix this problem, and sometimes it worked and sometimes she didn't. Sometimes it's just to fix yourself. We finally identified that the problem was the Realtek RTL8188EE 802.11 bgn Wi-Fi adapter. After much frustration, thinking it was a daily upgrade compatibility problem, I finally looked up the problem on the line and discovered everything HP has this problem. I tried most of the solutions on hp's solution site to no avail until I ran into one post that told HP technical support fixed the problem with the help of a device manager, but he didn't know what they did to solve the problem. There is one thing I found that fulfilled my theory that something was closing the adapter. On Windows 10 and possibly ogher computers, go to the control panel, select devices, select the device manager's link at the bottom of the page, find network adapters, select Realtek RTL8188EE 802.11 bgn Wi-Fi Adapter. In pop-up, select power management tab. Note that the default is allowing your computer to turn off this device to save energy. This setup was obviously turned off by our Wi-Fi every time my wife watched Netflix on Wi-Fi long enough to run a low battery, by activating the default computer in order to prevent battery damage. Turning this mkews us user device manager and and we need to be more aware of the damage that we can do running our battery low. Unselect will allow the computer to turn off this device to save energy. Next, find you network page link settings at the bottom of the Internet access icon pop-up list in the task line at the bottom of the screen, find x'd from the Wi-Fi network you use, double click on it and select connect even if you automatically connect checked and enter your key network your Wi-Fi provider gave you and your done. My laptop is two years old and although I had the best intentions when it came to recharging, I would sometimes get bogged down in something else rather than turn it off in time. It's not accurate to say, Oh, you, come turn me off at the right time. Now I'm tied to my power cord at all times, not sure if I care to invest in a new battery or just try to save up for a new laptop, probably not HP. I read with great interest above the post where the guy (a student here who should be made technology, in my books, how he actually thought about looking at SETTINGS) and applied his suggestions. Of course, I was set up to turn off the power to save. I would imagine that all my problems with my Wi-Fi arose after the death of my battery. Remembering, I know they are. I'm sure the driver update won't do any harm, so thanks for that. But it seems ridiculous that I found here more useful information from students than folk who have much more experience. I changed the settings and hoping that now I can stay online and may need to get that battery soon well done! I'll be back in a couple of days if it's not the final decision, but if it's you probably won't see me... Here's hoping you won't! I bought the HP Pavilion 14-n055sa equipped with the same WiFi module, and it never seemed to connect to any WiFi long, even one couple of feet. When I left, I always had to take a USB WiFi adapter and a 5M CAT5, do anything at all. I use Windows (preinstalled) and Ubuntu in HDD-DVD Caddy. Ubuntu WiFi reception was the same, and the same any live OS I tend to use. It was very tiring, so one day I decided to find a problem with several pci-e WiFi adapters I was lying around. Nothing seemed to improve and it made me very sad. I recently found some spare antennae from an old scrap laptop and plugged leads and was amazed when everything pops into life, with a good signal from the neighbors around. So it seemed the antenna was broken, which meant a complete disassembly .. The antennas are a small etching PCB stuck behind the LCD on either side of the camera. When I pulled the antenna off the back cover I noticed something shiny on the glue of one PCB. A piece of wire about 4 mm was attached to the black antenna, which I don't recognize anywhere else. This was obviously shorting out RF WiFi signals. Seemed like sabotage to me... But now it works just fine, though not as good as the antenna signal from old laptop tests. Ho hum .. I just have to live with it...! The job is done well...! But I'm still not happy that I had to go to such lengths to fix the it.PS. Why doesn't Windows work as well or fast as Ubuntu...?
