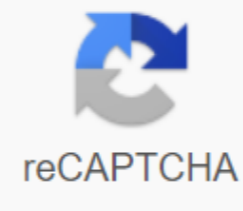

Sura emphasizes that no man can impose his will on another; it can only guide and set an example (67:26). Accommodation and coherence with other surami The idea of textual communication between the verses of the chapter was discussed under various names such as nazm and munasabah in non-English literature and consistency, textual relations, intertextuality and unity in English literature. Hamiduddin Farahi, an Islamic scholar of the Indian subcontinent, is known for his work on the concept of the nazm, or consistency, in the Koran. Fakhruddin al-Razi (died 1209 AD), arkashi (died 1392) and a number of other classical as well as modern Koranic scholars have contributed to the research. Thus, the entire Koran is a well-connected and systematic book. Each unit has a separate theme. Topics within the division are more or less in the order of revelation. Although scholars, including Ibn Taii, claim that Muhammad commented on the entire Koran, others, including Ghazali, cite a limited number of stories, indicating that he commented on only part of the Koran. In any case, a higher number of hadith increases the importance of the appropriate sura from a certain point of view. This sura has a special place in the statements, as well as in the practice of Muhammad, which may be observed by these related Akhadits. Imam Ahmad wrote from Abu Hurayrah that Muhammad said: Faith, there is a chapter in the Koran that contains thirty Ayat, who will intercede on behalf of his recitator until he is forgiven. (It is): Blessed to be the one in whose hand is dominion. (Sura al-Mulq 67) Muhammad said, There is a sura in the Koran, which is only thirty verses. He defends the one who reads it until he puts it in Janna 'Anas ibn Malik told Muhammad, as saying: There is a Sura that will beg his reciter until he forces him to enter heaven. Muhammad said, Sura al-Mulq is the protector of the torment of the grave, Jabir said it was a custom not to sleep until he read Tabarakalladhi Biyadihil Mulk (Al-Mulk) and Alif Lam Mim Tanziel (Al-Sajda). Before going to bed, he read Sura al-Sajdhu and Suru al-Mulk (in Arabic). Abdullah ibn Abbas reported that Muhammad said: It is my wish/love that Surakhtul Mulk should be in the heart of every Muslim, Ibn Abbas said that one of Muhammad's comrades set up his tent over the grave, not realizing that it was a grave, and in it there was a man who read Sura Tabarakalldhi Biyadihil Mulk to the end. He went and said to Muhammad, who said, This is the Defender; This is The defender who defends against the punishment of Allah Taal Khalid bin Madam said of Surat al-Mulk and Al-Sadzth that these two suras will fight for their recitator in the grave and will say: O Allah! If we belong to your book, take our intercession in his favor. In case we don't, get us destroyed. These suras will distribute wings like birds, and save man from the torment of the grave. It has been proven that Abdallah ibn Masood said: Whoever reads Tabarakalldha Biyadihil Mulk (i.e. Sura al-Mulk) every night, Allah will protect him from the torment of the grave. In the time of the Messenger of Allah, we used to call him al-mania (what protects). In the Book of Allah it is a sura that, whoever reads it every night, has done very well. Abdullah ibn Masood reportedly said, A man will be approached in the grave with his feet, from his chest, and then from his head. And every time that Sura defends him, he says, There's nothing you can do about him, he's read Sura Malk. Abdullah ibn Masood goes on to state: This is called Al-Ma'anea. For he protects the grave from punishment. Ibn Umar said that one day when Muhammad read verse 2 (The one who created death and life so that He could test you, which of you is better in business), and when he reached the words better in business, he stopped and explained that better in deeds is the man who most refrains from what Allah has forbidden and is always ready to obey him. Yahya told me from Malik from Ibn Shihab that Humaid ibn Abd al-Rahman ibn Auf told him that Surat al-Ikhlās (Sura 112) was equal to a third of the Koran, and that Surat al-Mulq (Sura 67) had pleaded with its owner.
