



# ST. JOHN PAUL II LITURGICAL CENTER UPDATE

The Christmas Season traditionally ends on February 2<sup>nd</sup> and therefore, in Polish tradition, Christmas decorations are kept until that date. The reason is that 40 days after Christmas we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the child Jesus in the temple and the purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary following the customs of the Old Testament, for according to the Book of Leviticus, a mother was considered unclean for 40 days after giving birth to a son. We may read some extracts from the homily of St. John Paul II delivered for this feast in 1997:



#### IN THE WORDS OF ST. JOHN PAUL II

Forty days after his birth, Jesus was taken by Mary and Joseph to the temple to be presented to the Lord (cf. Lk 2:22), according to what the law of Moses prescribes: "Every first-born male shall be consecrated to the Lord" (Lk 2:23); and to offer in sacrifice "a pair of turtle doves or two young pigeons, in accord with the dictate in the law of the Lord" (Lk 2:24).

In recalling these events, the liturgy intentionally and precisely follows the sequence of Gospel events: the completion of the 40 days following Christ's birth. It does the same, later, with regard to the period between the Resurrection and the Ascension into heaven.

Three basic elements can be seen in the Gospel event celebrated today: the mystery of the coming, the reality of the meeting and the proclamation of the prophecy.

First of all, the mystery of the coming. The biblical readings we have heard stress the extraordinary nature of God's coming.... However, the liturgy looks beyond. In that 40-day-old infant it sees the "light" destined to illumine the nations, and presents him as the "glory" of the people of Israel (cf. Lk 2:32) ...

The second characteristic element of today's celebration is the reality of the meeting. Even if no one was waiting for Joseph and Mary when they arrived hidden among the people at the temple in Jerusalem with the baby Jesus, something most unusual occurs. Here they meet persons guided by the Holy Spirit...

Simeon and Anna: a man and a woman, representatives of the Old Covenant, who, in a certain sense, had lived their whole lives for the moment when the temple of Jerusalem would be visited by the expected Messiah. Simeon and Anna understand that the moment has come at last, and reassured by the meeting, they can face the last phase of their life with peaceful hearts: "Lord, now let your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation" (Lk 2:29-30) . . .

The third element that appears in this feast is prophecy: today truly prophetic words resound...

The elderly Simeon adds, turning to Mary: "Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is spoken against (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), that thoughts out of many hearts may be revealed" (Lk 2:34-35).

Thus while we are still at the dawn of Jesus' life, we are already oriented to Calvary. It is on the Cross that Jesus will be definitively confirmed as a sign of contradiction, and it is there that his Mother's heart will be pierced by the sword of sorrow. We are told it all from the beginning, on the 40th day after Jesus' birth, on the feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, so important in the Church's liturgy.

# SHRINE OF ST. JOHN PAUL II AMONG THE 12 PILGRIMAGE SITES FOR THE JUBILEE IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF DETROIT

The Church celebrates ordinary jubilees every 25 years. In

December 2024, Pope Francis ushered in the Holy Year 2025 by opening the Holy Doors of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome for a year of grace, forgiveness and renewal — centered on the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope."

According to the Detroit Catholic feature, "Archbishop designates 12 Detroit-area pilgrimage sites ahead of Jubilee 2025," the Archdiocesan Shrine of St. John Paul II here at the heart of the Orchard Lake Schools campus has been designated by Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron as a pilgrimage site for pilgrims to visit to receive a



plenary indulgence. "While the Holy Doors in Rome will be the only such doors throughout the world during Jubilee 2025, Detroit-area pilgrims won't have to travel to Rome to experience the jubilee's graces," Archbishop Vigneron said.

In 1470, Pope Paul II established the practice of celebrating jubilees every 25 years, instead of 50, to allow more people to experience a Holy Year within their lifetimes.



# **NEW PICR EXHIBIT FOCUSED ON BIOGRAPHY, ART, HISTORY**

The Polish Institute of Culture and Research is thrilled to announce *Biography, Art, History: Polish-American Memories of Great Men and Women* will open at the Galeria this February. Through the lens of portraiture, the exhibition will examine the various ways notable persons throughout history have risen to embody Polish-American experiences and values: freedom, self-determination, generosity, bravery, and the pursuit of truth. A combination of artworks and historical documents will explore the lives and legacies of: Nicolas Copernicus, Tadeusz Kościuszko, Kazimierz Pułaski, Helena Modrzejewska, Józef Piłsudski, Henry Ford, St. John Paul II and Klara Święczkowska. The selection of these figures spans contexts both local and global, from centuries past to recent generations, who have made a significant impact on the cultural identity of Polish-Americans. Whether it be through scientific discovery, military prowess, magnetic creative inspiration, innovations in industry or a tireless defense of the faith, whether they were contentious or beloved, the featured individuals devoted their skills and talents to causes that transcended personal circumstance.

The exhibition will demonstrate the ways in which visual culture memorializes the past through a wide range of media: medals, posters, paintings, tapestries, sculptures, photographs and more. Each material offers a unique method of description which emphasizes a range of traits which cumulatively provide a nuanced depiction of each person. As stories are retold and reinterpreted, personal images and artifacts transform into symbols that reach far beyond the anecdotes or likenesses they represent. Their influence echos and expands into the present as the commemorative parades, holidays, and institutions that honor past heroes continue to create shared experiences and associations that build collective identity and inspire future growth.

A dynamic selection of performances and lectures expanding on these memorable figures and their influence on Polish-American culture will complement the run of the exhibition, which is set to be on view throughout the Spring of 2025.



#### A NOTE FROM THE GALERIA MANAGER



Candlemas or the Feast of the Purification of Blessed Virgin Mary falls on February 2<sup>nd</sup> and marks the presentation of Jesus at the Temple by Joseph and Mary, thereby marking the end of the Christmas season. This day holds significance in Polish folk traditions, as parishioners brought special beeswax candles to mass for a special blessing- these candles are called "gromnice." The gromnica (or "thunder candle" in English) had a place in Polish village life. According to ancient tradition, they were believed to be imbued with protection from the Virgin Mary, the candle was often lit and placed near windows during storms to ward off any danger or destruction away from the home. These blessings were to be renewed each year at Candlemass.

In rural Polish villages, gromnice were often given as gifts to individuals at their time of birth or baptism and remained an important part of ceremonies throughout that person's life:

from First Communion, to Confirmation, Anointing, and even Vigils, lit for one final time at one's funeral. Some even buried the gromnica with its

owner, as tradition stated the candle "died" alongside.

A few examples of the visual culture surrounding these traditions are held within the collections of the Polish Institute of Culture and Research. Notable examples include a skillful painted copy and several printed reproductions of Our Lady of the Thunder Candle by Piotr Stachiewicz. This image depicts the Virgin Mary in a snowy field, faced by a pack of vicious wolves as she stands guard at a village gate in the dead of night. Her pale, white form seems to emerge gracefully from the snow itself; her face glows with a peaceful expression, as a diagonal strip of painted gold light demonstrates her brandishing of the long gromnica in her hands as defense against the snapping jaws of her foes. In the distance, a home is nestled safely in the hills behind, safely protected by the supernatural powers of the Virgin Mary. The scene beautifully depicts Polish tales related to gromnica and the effectiveness of their blessings, filled with details tied to the daily realities and risks of agrarian life, ultimately reinforcing confidence in the spiritual care and protection of the Blessed Mother as she leads earthly souls toward salvation in her Son, Jesus Christ.
