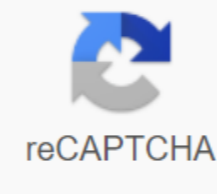

## Columbine shooting victims autopsy reports

Below are clinical reports of autopsy and autopsy summary of those who died at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. No disrespect is intended by this posting: This information is a public record and its display here to help people better understand the nature and depravity of this crime as well as to help illustrate the points raised in this web document, such as Brian Rohrbough's insistence his son Danny was killed by friendly fire. That view was taken when the Rohrboughs told at least four times Lt. James Taylor - a Denver-area officer and family friend for 20 years - that he had seen Daniel Rohrbough get shot by officers, in part by naming Sgt. Dan O'Shea as the guilty party. In 2001, Rorbo filed a lawsuit against Jefferson County on the basis of this information. The family even recorded one such statement, which was used as evidence in a lawsuit Rohrboughs filed when Lt. Taylor retracted his application a few months later. Even later, Taylor admitted he was making the whole story up. He never disclosed why he would do such a thing. An intense monitoring and independent investigation in 2002 by the El Paso County Sheriff's Department determined that Danny's fatal wounds were from Eric's weapon, in contrast to Jeff's decision that it was Dylan's shots that killed him. According to investigators, Sergeant O'Shea was not even on the side of the school where Danny was, arriving half an hour after Danny's death. In 2003, Rorbow filed a lawsuit against Lt. James Taylor for defamation, negligence and outrageous conduct. A judge orders the release of Rohrbough autopsy officer Kieran Nicholson to Denver Post staff writer January 31, 2001 - A judge on Tuesday ordered the release of a full autopsy report on Columbine High School victim Daniel Rohrbough and autopsies of A summary of other victims, including Dylan Klebold, one of the two shooters. Rohrbough's autopsy report and initial portions of other reports containing ... - opinions on the cause of death should be made public, U.S. District Judge Brooke Jackson ruled in a 10-page order. The families of Columbine's victims fought for the autopsy to be sealed, indicating that the disclosure would cause them, the local community and the public great harm and grief. We're disappointed that anything is being released because we don't want anything released, said attorney Jim Rouse, who represents several families in Rohrbough's. Were grateful that most of the materials remain sealed. Rohrbo's autopsy is being released in full because of a federal lawsuit his family filed against the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. They claim Daniel was shot by a police officer, not Eric Harris or Klebol. There is a public interest in knowing whether Daniel was killed by friendly fire, as Rorbow claimed, Jackson wrote. Daniel Rorbow's father, Brian, who sued the sheriff's office, said he was ready to release the autopsy report. I think it's important for people to understand that he was running away from the militants who were on the hill behind him and he was shot from the front, he said. The lethal bullet could not have come from Clebold and Harris. It had to come from law enforcement at the bottom of the hill. The autopsy of the victim, Isaiah Schuls and Harris, has already been made public without objection from their families. Autopsy reports of other victims of the April 20, 1999 massacre were available to their parents and the wife of slain teacher Dave Sanders. The Denver Post asked the court to release the remaining autopsy. Overall, we are pleased that Judge Jackson made the release of information about all victims, allowing the public to assess how government officials performed their duties, said attorney Steven D. zensberg, who represents The Post. But we are concerned about some of the limitations in his ruling. The Jefferson County coroner's office did not release a summary or a full autopsy of Rohrbo on Tuesday. Coroner Nancy Bodelson said she would first consult with the district attorney's office. Rousey said it will be up to his clients whether they want to sit tight and let the order stand or whether they want to appeal. In his order, Jackson wrote that the public will oppose the publication if they realize that (it) can cause further grief and trauma to those closest to the cause. However, Jackson ruled that the executive summary of the autopsy portion would be released because it would not cause significant harm to the public interest. It's no secret that these people died of gunshot wounds. In the order, Jackson wrote that clebolds were also victims of the tragedy. They lost their son, too. They also have a sense of pain and grief, no doubt compounded by the horror of knowing that their son was the perpetrator of these acts. Rachel Scott: Rachel was shot four times by Eric in the left temple, chest, arm and hip. She died at the scene from a gunshot wound to the head. Daniel Rorbow: Dylan shot Dylan three times in the chest, stomach and knee. The death was the result of chest injuries. He died within five minutes. Kyle Velazquez: Kyle was shot several times in the head, left shoulder, and three in the back. His death was due to gunshot wounds to the head and upper back. He died instantly. Steve Curnow: Steve was shot once by Eric in the neck. He died from a single gunshot wound to the neck. He died within seven minutes. Cassie Bernal: Cassie was shot twice by Eric, one in the right temple and one in the arm (finger). Her death was caused by a gunshot wound to the head. He died instantly. Isaiah Shuls: Isaiah was shot twice in the left arm and chest by Eric. The death was caused by a shotgun wound to the chest. He died within two minutes. Matt Kechter: Matt was shot once in the chest by Dylan. He died of a gunshot wound to the chest. He died about three minutes later. Lauren Townsend: Lauren was killed by Dylan and shot about 9 times, with some shots to her lower chest, left back, right ear, right hip, right arm and left thigh. He died because of all the numerous fatal shootings. He died within two minutes. John Tomlin: John was shot by both Eric and Dylan. Eric shot John in the chest, but Dylan shot him in the head and back. His death was due to multiple gunshots, but Dylan was fatally shot in the head. He died almost instantly. Kelly Fleming: Kelly was shot by Eric in the lower back. She died from one wound to the back. He died within three to five minutes. Daniel Mauser: Daniel was shot twice by Eric, once in the nose, once in the finger, and grazed on the scalp. The death was due to a fractured neck with spinal cord injury due to a gunshot to the nose. He died within three minutes. Corey DePooter: Corey was shot by Dylan three times, with some shots to the neck, chest, right back and left arm. The death was caused by several shots in a row. He died instantly. Eric Harris: Eric died of gunshot wounds to the roof of his mouth. Death was instantaneous. Dylan Klebold: Dylan also died from self-inflicted gunshot wounds, but in his left temple. He died about five minutes after that. Dave Sanders: Dave was shot three times by Eric in the neck, right upper back and chest. His death was the result of gunshot wounds to the neck, head and back.
