Delta math answers

This year, instead of worksheets, your students will use an online resource to practice their math skills. Delta Math allows students to practice their math skills independently while giving them instant feedback on their work. I really like this site because it provides the necessary support for students. Before you write an answer, students can click the button to see a similar example with a complete solution. After students are entering in in a response, DeltaMath tells them whether they are correct in showing a complete step-by-step solution. Every week students are given math skills to practice. The goal of the student is to get 5-10 problems corrected, depending on the task. The program indicates 100% when they have reached it. Click here to work at Delta Math with your student. With just under five minutes left in the classroom, I ask everyone's attention. It's hard to get everyone because some students are so involved in trying to solve a few more problems, but it's really important to debrief today's work rather than just letting the class end. As a debrief, I say class, Stand up if you were crazy today. It's a funny thing about working with a computer: you can't argue with it. If you misspell a negative sign, if you write a fraction upside down, if your decimal is just a little off, the computer can't give you the benefit of the doubt and make some assumption about what you were thinking. It's 1 and 0's. It can be frustrating for my kids. Two-thirds of them stand up. Great place for me to be on the go. I say that makes some kids laugh and make another tilt their heads sideways. Being crazy is the first step towards learning something. This is the first step towards a better I stopped. I want someone to argue with me or support my argument. Sometimes they do, and we can make a conversation from there. If that doesn't happen, I asked: Why did the bulb invented? I let some students respond, and then I shouted, Because people were crazy that night it was so dark! I know I'm massively bending to paraphrase history, but I'm proving pointing to my kids. Why were cars invented? I asked, and now the kids get the point. They answer: Because people were for having to walk everywhere! Okay, I say.
