# ACACIA QUILT GUILD FIREHOUSE QUILT PROJECT DUE DATE IS MARCH 1, 2018!!!

(Updated information appears in red)

#### Background:

- 1. Buena Park Fire Station 61 was destroyed by fire in January 2017. Construction on a new firehouse has begun with completion expected in Spring 2017.
- 2. The grand opening will be in the summer date to be announced.
- 3. Beth Swift, Acacia Member and Buena Park mayor, proposed that the guild make quilts for the residents of the new firehouse. Beth is also Chair of the Orange County Fire Authority.
- 4. Special labels will be printed for this special project.

#### **How many quilts?**

30 bed guilts (XL twin) will be made for the firefighters and staff who will reside at the firehouse.

#### Quilt Size?

Each quilt will be an extra-long twin (XL Twin): 70" x 90"

#### **Quilt Themes:**

Traditional or modern designs that read as neutral or masculine (all of the overnight residents will be men): patriotic or plaid, deeper, darker colors

#### **Deadline for completion:**

- MARCH MEETING -for tops
- APRIL MEETING for completed quilts

#### **Batting and Backing:**

Acacia Quilt Guild will contribute backing and batting for some of the quilts.

### Firehouse T-Shirt Quilt

A T-Shirt quilt will be made to display in the new firehouse. John Peat, Mayor of Cypress and a retired firefighter, has donated several t-shirts. Susan Stokes and Phyllis Campbell volunteered to put it together.

#### Firehouse Wall Hanging Quilt

Barbara Purks of Orange Grove Quilters Guild was a visitor at the February meeting. She has made a wall hanging with firefighter fabric to donate to this project.

# **Fabricators**

The <u>Fabricators</u> are sponsoring a "Quilt Challenge", beginning at the March meeting. This will be a Challenge with a difference, however, because you will not be given an ugly fabric to start with, and we are not trying to make the finish product difficult to make. We hope this will be an easy project and that everyone will want to get involved. Because it is a "Fabricator" project, we hope to use as much fabric from the storage unit as possible. Donated fabric does no one any good if it just sits there gathering dust.

Instructions for the Challenge follow this article and additional copies will be available at the March General Meeting. Start Planning Ahead and see you at the meeting!

# **Instructions for the Fabricator Quilt Challenge**

<u>Objective:</u> To use up fabric in our storage unit and make additional quilts for philanthropy. All quilts are to be donated.

#### Instructions

- 1 Each participant in the Challenge will receive one yard of a floral or print fabric and one and a quarter yards (minimum) of a solid or a "reads as solid" fabric. These two fabrics have been paired, but you get to choose which of these matched pairs to use as the start for your quilt.
- 2 You then add a minimum of three (3) fat quarters from the storage unit selection available. The fat quarters can be the same print, or different, your choice. You may add additional fat quarters, but at least three of the fat quarter fabrics chosen must be visible in the finished quilt.
- 3. Since everyone will be working with different fabrics, your choices will be recorded in a photograph of you (or your name badge) with the fabrics you have chosen. Also, we would like to have "before" and "after" pictures for the winning quilt.

#### NO FABRIC IS TO BE RETURNED TO THE STORAGE UNIT!

- 4. Finished quilts should be a minimum of 48" by 66". (No maximum) There are no limitations on the pattern used, simple or complex, the choice is yours. "Finished" in this case means quilted with a finished binding, but a label is not necessary. Lisa has labels for donated quilts.
- 5. Batting and backing material will be available at the April and May general meetings. Judging will be on the most attractive quilt, by a vote of those in attendance at the June General meeting.
- 6. **Prizes!** A \$50 gift certificate to M&L for the winning (most attractive) quilt; a \$30 gift certificate to M&L for second place. Additional prizes may be awarded, depending on how many quilts are in the competition and the creativity of the quilts entered in the contest. The winning quilt will be kept for next year's Tea. All other quilts will be donated.
