ACACIA QUILT GUILD – SMALL, BUT MIGHTY! NEWSLETTER –MARCH 2019 President's Report – Barbra Riley

Dear Members,

Even though we are currently focused on the upcoming Tea and Auction and everyone is frantically finishing up projects for our most important fundraiser, we should not lose sight of one of the important aspects of Acacia: Philanthropy. We are currently looking at new places to donate quilts; if we had a specific destination with a designated use it will be easier to determine what type of quilts to make.

Recently, the Buena Park Police Department requested four quilts for children taken into custody due to a difficult situation. We donated two quilts to them last year, just as a trial run, and they found they do use them. Child Services are usually called to care for the children involved in a bad situation, but occasionally this job falls to the local police. We have child-sized quilts, but it would be better if we had some fun, brightly colored, themed quilts to offer. We told Jessica Lopez, our contact at the Buena Park Police Department, that we would bring them four more quilts after the March 7th General Meeting. *** Does anyone have any small, cheerful, child-friendly quilts to donate to a child in a difficult situation?

Our supply of quilts to donate is currently low because we donated 43 quilts to Thomas House in November. More donations were made around Christmas, and many quilts have been designated for the Tea & Auction, leaving only about five or six completed quilts left in the storage unit. We donated a lot more than that though: there were 34 quilts given to the firemen at Buena Park Station 61, 32 quilts donated to Thomas House in March of 2018 by Lisa Sullivan, over 100 stockings and pillowcases, and 54 pet beds donated to displaced pets from the Paradise fire through the Butte Humane Society. We have done a lot in one year and we deserve a pat on the back, at least! But, after the Tea & Auction, let's get back to making quilts.

There are, however, a number of quilt tops that have been donated to Acacia that are still in need of quilting, so that will be our first priority. If you would like some quilting practice, we are making plans to schedule some workshops to quilt those UFO's. Quilting a quilt is like most things in life: *practice, practice, practice*. If you'd like to practice quilting, we can help you out!


JELLY ROLL RACE WINNERS!

- During the Tea, we will announce the winners, then move the quilts to the Silent Auction.
- Our goal is to have 8 to 12 quilts to display, but more are welcome. Quilts are due by the March General meeting on Thursday, March 7th.

QUILTER OF THE MONTH – Lori Ramsey



Our March 2019 Quilter of the Month is Lori Ramsey! Lori was born in the Midwest in Columbus, Ohio. She has an older brother and a younger sister. Her mother taught her to sew when Lori was in elementary school and she honed her skill as a Campfire Girl by sewing different projects which included a beaded Indian gown, Campfire vest, and a swim suit jacket.

Lori's dad was relocated to California for work when she was in the 8th grade. She remembers the plane descending into LAX through a bank of thick brown smog, leaving behind her beloved Campfire Girls and her Palomino. While in high school she took Home Ec over the summer and joined the Chess Club and the German Club during the school year ("all those guys!") She attended Harbor College and CSULB, majoring in Forensic Chemistry and Law Enforcement. She worked in security for Northrop, which gave her the opportunity to travel to almost every state in the U.S. Lori presently lives in Lakewood with one of her three sons, and two cats.

Lori learned to quilt in 2010 at a friendship group. Prior to that she and her husband went to county fairs to look at the quilts and he was her biggest cheerleader in encouraging her to make one of her own. MARCH BLOCK OF THE MONTH

'Wildflowers and Clover'

After all our rain, Spring is bound to have a bumper crop of wildflowers and clover. That is the inspiration for this block.


Directions:

- White on white: 2- 8" squares, 4- 3 ½" squares, 1- 5 ½" squares
- Yellow: 1-8" square
- Lime green: 1- 5 ½" square

Place white and lime green 5 ½" squares right sides together (RST). Pin and sew 1/4" from all 4 edges. Cut "x" corner to corner, open all 4 HSTs and square to 3 1/2".

Put white and yellow 8" squares together RST, draw "x" diagonally, sew 1/4" on both sides of lines, cut horizontally and vertically across center, then cut on drawn lines, open all 8 HSTs and square to 3 1/2".

Sew together row by row, following photo layout below.
