

QUILTER OF THE MONTH

Marianne Mahoney

Marianne is a native Californian. She was born in Lynwood and attended high school at Cerritos High. She then attended Woodbury University in Burbank, graduating with a degree in Interior Design. Her experience led her, and later us, to help future patients with breast cancer by providing these bags. We are also collecting pillowcases and Christmas stockings for our Christmas giveaways. At the June General meeting, 50 pillowcase kits were taken by Susan Magpayo and in July, she returned all 50 completed pillowcases! Thank You, Susan!!! In addition to the pillowcases we give at Christmas, we hope to help a charity called, "Ryan's Case for Smiles", by adding to their monthly donation of 100 pillowcases to CHOC Hospital and Kaiser. "Case for Smiles" has asked for only juvenile-themed fabric please.

I did it! I got my challenge piece - RIP AND PASS - done for Acacia and turned in on time. (*Quilt on right in above left photo). I have always liked a good challenge in anything through the years and I wondered what I was going to do with this one. Fortunately, we could add additional pieces. In Kaffe Fassett's Heritage Quilts 20 Designs from Rowen for patchwork and quilting book I saw a lovely Trip Around the World quilt done in brightly colored patterned material. Well, I thought I could do something like that with this challenge – and I could use 2 ½ inch strips – and I could use the leftover strips toward piecing a worm quilt.

Well, with my 90-year-old Mom permanently moving in, and moving all her stuff, and everything else, this simple quilt did become a bit of a challenge to get done, but life happens. I used a simple wavy stitch on my Janome for quilting up and down, and up and down, and up and down. Thanks to Barbra and Sonia for encouraging me to get it done and several other ladies for offering to take it for me as I had to miss the last Acacia General Meeting ---but my quilt was completely done and is going to Thomas House! I was able to use up some odds and ends to make more strips to go around and the colors worked well. Maybe in a couple of years I will be able to make an actual Trip Around the World happen...and in less than 80 days!

Did you get your challenge done???? Congratulations to all of those who did!

If you did not, you can still finish it and share it with us. We have a lot of marvelously creative and industrious people in this Guild.

ACACIA QUILT GUILD SECRET PAL QUESTIONNAIRE 2019-2020

Program will run for 9 (NINE) months: September 2019 - May 2020

*"I will be collecting your completed questionnaires (via email or snail mail) from now until **August 8, 2018**. After that I will be working hard to match you up with a new Secret Pal. After I take the forms and associate each person with another and assign Secret Pals, the forms will be sent to the Giver and a copy retained for the files. I am not a participant.*

*During the months of **September through May**, using the suggestions from the questionnaire, the Giver is asked to bring a gift for the Recipient. The gifts should cost between \$10.00 and \$12.00, or be a block or handcrafted item you made. The gift(s) may be something from the questionnaire or just a warm fuzzy you think that person would appreciate. Remember, it's OK to use your discount coupons or get sale items if you think this person would appreciate them.*

*The gifts should be wrapped or bagged and tagged with the Recipients name clearly marked. These gifts will be placed on the counter designated as the **"SECRET PAL DROP OFF"**. During the break or after the meeting please look for your gift.*

*Periodically, it is encouraging for the Recipient to send a **"Thank You" note and/or token** to the giver. This can be done in the same way as the gifts are exchanged--by placing them on the Secret Pal Drop-off table. The envelope should read "To (your name goes here)'s Secret Pal". I will be sure your Giver receives it.*

*In **April 2020**, Recipients will receive a copy of information from the Giver's form. This form can be used to find a "Thank You" gift for the Pal who has been surprising you and thinking about you and learning about you for the last few months.*

*The final gift exchange will take place during the **May 2020** meeting. Please bring a final gift for your recipient AND A Thank You gift for the person giving to you should you choose.*


