ACACIA QUILT GUILD – SMALL, BUT MIGHTY! NEWSLETTER –SEPTEMBER 2019 President's Report – Barbra Riley

Dear Members,

For those of you who have not heard, the Buena Park City Council has invited Acacia to display quilts in the City Council Chambers November 6th, 2019, through January 15, 2020. This display will be a great opportunity to bring attention to guild activities. Some of the display quilts will be donated to Thomas House or other organizations, but we should make sure our main focus is on "fun" quilts which were made for a challenge or at a workshop. Let's show our best work. Quilts are limited to 48" wide, so the large "WOW" quilts won't be in this one, but we should still be able to come up with some impressive quilts made by Acacia members. The Council Chamber has 135 linear feet of display space, with a ten-foot ceiling. That's a lot of "small" quilts!

Denise Howard, our first Vice President, will be collecting quilts to be displayed. Any quilt sewn by a member of Acacia qualifies, but those done as part of a challenge or at a workshop will do the best job of showing what Acacia Quilt Guild is all about. We have had two workshops on paper piecing since I have been a member. I did not finish either of mine, but if you finished your quilt, bring it in to display. What other workshops have resulted in interesting quilts? Sadly, the only quilts I have completed from a workshop were either donated to philanthropy or given as Christmas gifts. (It seems a little tacky to ask for a quilt back when it was given as a Christmas gift!) If you haven't given all your quilts away, look through them and decide which ones would display well.

Many of the challenges in the past have resulted in quilts which were donated, but not all. I will be submitting my entry in the 2012 Challenge, "Make Me Smile", to Denise for consideration, even though it was not the winner of the contest. What challenge quilts do YOU still have? The Council Chambers have a lot of wall space and it would be nice if we could send them more quilts than needed and let them make the decision on which to display.

Since the quilts will be on public display, you will be asked to complete a release form which Denise will have for you when you bring in your quilt(s). The quilt will also need a label, and either a sleeve or "loops" at the top to act as hangers. (There will be an example of this at the September meeting.) The quilts will be put on ¼ inch dowels and hung on a canvas-covered wall. Please make sure your label includes your name, the name of the quilt, the date completed, and some background information, OR attach a note with this information. Each quilt will be displayed with a small printed plaque with the name of the quilt, the name of the quilter, and one sentence giving the reason for making it.

We already have one donation of a small quilt that was originally purchased at the last Tea. Quilts auctioned off at one of our Teas are also a possible source of display quilts. Whatever the source, our goal is to attract some attention to Acacia Quilt Guild and what we do for the community and how much we enjoy doing it. This is our chance to show off, let's do it!

Please bring your contributions of display quilts to the September 5th meeting.

This month we will use food-themed fabric to make microwavable bowl cozies. Microwave bowl cozies require all cotton materials: cotton fabric, cotton thread and all cotton batting. We have the fabric and the batting but bring cotton thread, if you have it. A detailed pattern will be available. Microwavable bowl cozies have always sold well at the boutiques.

The 14th is also a Free Sew Day, so bring whatever you'd like to work on. There will also be an assortment of kits to take home or work on at the Fabricators meeting; quilt kits that only need to be quilted, plus the usual kits for pillowcases and Christmas stockings.

Program will run for 9 (NINE) months: September 2019 - May 2020 Coordinator: Sonia Das (562) 607-2384 soniadas@yahoo.com

"I will be collecting your completed questionnaires (via email or snail mail) from now until <u>August 8, 2018</u>. After that I will be working hard to match you up with a new Secret Pal. After I take the forms and associate each person with another and assign Secret Pals, the forms will be sent to the Giver and a copy retained for the files. I am not a participant.

During the months of <u>September through May</u>, using the suggestions from the questionnaire, the Giver is asked to bring a gift for the Recipient. The gifts should cost between \$10.00 and \$12.00, or be a block or handcrafted item you made. The gift(s) may be something from the questionnaire or just a warm fuzzy you think that person would appreciate. Remember, it's OK to use your discount coupons or get sale items if you think this person would appreciate them.

The gifts should be wrapped or bagged and tagged with the Recipients name clearly marked. These gifts will be placed on the counter designated as the <u>"SECRET PAL DROP OFF"</u>. During the break or after the meeting please look for your gift.

Periodically, it is encouraging for the Recipient to send a <u>"Thank You" note and/or token</u> to the giver. This can be done in the same way as the gifts are exchanged--by placing them on the Secret Pal Drop-off table. The envelope should read "To (your name goes here)'s Secret Pal". I will be sure your Giver receives it.

In <u>April 2020</u>, Recipients will receive a copy of information from the Giver's form. This form can be used to find a "Thank You" gift for the Pal who has been surprising you and thinking about you and learning about you for the last few months.

The final gift exchange will take place during the <u>May 2020</u> meeting. Please bring a final gift for your recipient AND A Thank You gift for the person giving to you should you choose.






