

## How to make a fake drivers license online for free

If you want to check if your driving privileges have been suspended or restored, the Florida Department of Road Safety and Vehicle Safety gives you free access to your driving records online. You can also call the customer service center or go to your local office to check with the FDHSMV representative directly. You can even check by ordering a driver's license, but it will cost you. The Department of Road Safety and Motor Vehicles provides links to various locations across the state on its website (. Click on the link for the county you're interested in. The next page will list all service centers in your chosen county, including their physical address, work hours and phone number. To make an appointment at a specific location, click on the link to the meeting. If there is no reference, only walk in this place. The Department of Road and Vehicle Safety also allows you to check the status ( of your license online. Enter the driver's license number and the characters you see on the screen, and then click Enter. If the system returns the status to valid, your driving record is clear. Call the Customer Service Center ( at (850) 617-2000 from 7 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. on weekdays to find out about your status by phone. Enter your driver's license and Social Security number at the request of the automated system. FDHSMV advises drivers not to call from 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., as that's when it receives the most calls during the day. Another option is to order a copy of your driving record. However, this comes at a price of either \$8 or \$10, depending on the time period covered by the record and whether it is certified. You can order your entry in person at a service center or from a private provider, court clerk or tax collector authorized to provide FDHSMV services. You can also send your request by mail. Send Completed Driver's License Records Request Form and Board Bureau of Records, P.O. Box 5775, Tallahassee, FL 32314-5775. Accelerated requests go to the Bureau of Records, 2900 Apalachee Parkway, MS 90, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0575. Obtaining a driver's license is a rite of passage in our society today. Any Ohio driver who gets 12 points on his record within two years automatically receives a six-month suspension license, according to the Ohio Revised Code. If you are unsure how many points are on your driving record, you can check through the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles. You can request a free, unofficial two-year driving record by visiting the Ohio Bureau of Transportation's Ohio License/ID Check ( 2DriverAbstract. Enter your driver's license number, date of birth, first letter of your name and the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you need a three-year abstract, use the Driver Abstracts Order Online link on Oplates.com (. To find out how many points you have in the mail, download and complete the BMV (Form 1173) (. The form requires your name, address, date of birth, Social Security number and driver's license number. Send the form, along with a \$5 check for 2015, to the address on the form. If you request another person's driving records, you must also submit a BMV Form 5008 that must be signed and notarized. You can also call 1-866- 675-2837 to request a copy of the driver's protocol. Ohio Regional Centers for The Restoration of Driver's License and and The deputy registrar of licensing agencies also supply driver's records. In both locations, you must fill out a BMV Form 1173 ( and pay a \$5 fee at recovery centers and an \$8.50 fee to licensing agencies. A voluntary driver's license request, if you do not have a driver's license or do not want to share it with the state tax service, you will usually be given the opportunity to enter instead a specially issued state identification number. And if you don't or don't want to enter any number, then in most cases you can still file your state refund anyway. If, however, your software requires you to enter something in the driver's license number box, tax pros suggest entering all zeros so you can move on to the next stage of filing online. Announced as a website by the National Bureau of Motor Vehicles, it claims to offer a free search database for more than 121 million U.S. driver's license photos and license information. How can that be? The B.S. Amendment of the United States to the Freedom of Information Act, adopted on September 3, 2004, provides public access to the driver's information electronically, the promotional video reads. Under the Motor Vehicle Operator Identification Act (MOLIA), all U.S. states are required to comply with the B.S. Driver's Act and to keep an electronic copy of all valid driver's licenses in their state ... Thus, by filling out a simple web form, it is alleged that anyone can search for a centralized database of the Bureau containing more than 220 million driver's licenses. There is only one small hitch: it's a joke - it's not real! The reader describes what actually happens when you type in your name and search the site: If you enter the name, state, city and gender that comes up is a picture of a grinning monkey and a question: You really don't think you could get someone's driver's license online, right? The fact is that the so-called Vehicle Identification Act (MOLIA) does not exist. While there are several bonafide paid websites that provide access to driver's license data from states that allow it for legitimate purposes, it is not quite so easy to invade other people's privacy from your computer. Like most popular prank sites, this one succeeds not only because of its slick design and surface plausibility, but because it plays on people's very real fears - in this case, the fear of invasion of privacy. Some people have found this site so frustrating that they have already written to their congressmen about it; others are nonplussed and simple forward URL on their most gullible friends. Does this fake car website store visitors' personal information or leave cookies on their computers? The source code shows no signs of malicious activity. This may change without notice, however, and there are several other similar sites out there whose security is up for grabs, so proper precautions are recommended.
