Monthly Devotion: Exaltation of the Cross



An excerpt from the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, September 14, 1939, written by St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, OCD: "More than ever the cross is a sign of contradiction. The followers of the Antichrist show it far more dishonor than did the Persians who stole it. They desecrate the images of the cross, and they make every effort to tear the cross out of the hearts of Christians. All too often they have succeeded even with

those who, like us, once vowed to bear Christ's cross after him.... Therefore, the Savior today looks at us, solemnly probing us, and asks each one of us: Will you remain faithful to the Crucified? Consider carefully! The world is in flames, the battle between Christ and the Antichrist has broken into the open. If you decide for Christ, it could cost you your life. Carefully consider what you promise. ... The world is in flames. The conflagration can also reach our house. But high above the flames towers the cross. They cannot consume it. It is the path from earth to heaven. It will lift one who embraces it in faith, love, and hope into the bosom of the Trinity."

September 22-29 St. Thérèse Novena

This nine day novena is an excellent way to prepare for the feast day of Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus. There are many variations – some long, some short – you may have a favorite.

September 17: St. Albert of Jerusalem, Bishop & Lawgiver of Carmel

The Carmelite Rule of St. Albert of Jerusalem was given to the Brothers of the Most Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel between 1206 and 1214, and approved on January 30, 1226 by Pope Honorius III.

Monday - Friday in the Main Church:

Communal Rosary at 8:00am before the 8:30am Mass in the main church.

Emmanuel Church (Dayton) – Tuesdays

Miraculous Medal Novena with Adoration and Benediction at 7pm every Tuesday

Holy Angels Church (Sidney) – Thursdays

Exposition and Adoration begins after the Thursday 8:00am. Mass and continues all day until Benediction at 8:00pm. Confessions 7-8pm every Thursday.

Saint Peter Catholic Church (Huber Heights) – Fridays in Main Church

Exposition and Adoration begins after the Friday 8:30am Mass and continues all day until 4:00pm (note: in the case of a funeral adoration will be moved to the side chapel).
