A Patriotic Art & Essay Contest for K-12 Students

As the nation approaches the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 2026, Point Blank Community is hosting an art and essay contest celebrating America's Semiquincentennial.

This contest invites Coldspring-Oakhurst ISD, Onalaska ISD, and other students of the area in grades K-12 to reflect on what makes America special. The competition is divided into three levels: high school, middle school, and elementary school. Cash prizes will be awarded at each level in two areas: writing and artwork.

The high school winner will receive \$100 per category, while the top middle school and elementary school submissions will each earn \$50 in each category. Students may submit only one essay entry and/or one artwork entry. The submission deadline is June 1, 2026. First Place Essay Winners will have an opportunity to read their work on stage. All artwork will be displayed during the Celebrate America 250 Festival at 7360 US Hwy 190, Point Blank, Texas from 10 AM- 4 PM on Saturday, July 4, 2026.

Through art or essay, students are encouraged to share how their life, family traditions, community, or culture reflects the spirit of America. Work will be judged on the student's Voice and Clarity of Ideas. Students may choose from various prompts for essays and artwork listed below.

Middle School 6th – 8th Grades

Essay requirements are 100-400 word count writing to the prompt. Artwork may include drawing, painting, collage, digital art, or photography.

Artwork should represent the prompt selected. Maximum size for artwork submissions: 18"x 24".

Prompts

- **One Moment That Shaped America**

Choose one important event in U.S. history. Explain what happened and how it helped shape the country we live in today for your family and friends.

- **Unique America**

What makes America different from all other nations? What does this mean for you and your family and friends?

- **Pledge of Allegiance and Symbols**

Why do we say this pledge in America and what does it mean to you? What are some symbols of America and what do they mean to you and your family and friends?
